Comments:

I am in favor of this measure which permanently establishes the provisions of Act 195, mainly because it gives owners the rights to dispute any questionable non common element charges such as legal fees, fines, late fees and penalties, before paying these, and abolishes the wrongful priority of payments arrangements in which installment payments on debts owed associations are applied first to those incidental charges. When payments are not first applied to common element dues balances, an owner can remain indefinitely in debt because not only do these balances remain on account, but consequently their fees and penalties increase as well.

Moreover, consider that the reason some owners are in debt is that they were victims of fraudulent allegations by association boards, of covenant violations, and face foreclosure resulting from legal fees and fines high enough to cause those owners to default on their common element dues.

Aloha Chair Rhoads, Vice-Chair Keohokalole, and Members of the Committee,

I am Lila Mower, president of Kokua Council, one of Hawaii's oldest advocacy groups. Kokua Council is concerned about policies and practices which can impact the well-being of seniors and our community.

Kokua Council hosts an annual Policy and Legislative Priorities Community Meeting attended by representatives from over 50 organizations* to present their priorities. At the end of the 2019 annual meeting, a poll of participants indicated **strong support for the protection of condominium owners' rights.**

I am also leader of Hui 'Oia'i'o, informally known as "COCO," a coalition of over 300 property owners-mostly seniors--from over 150 common-interest associations.

Both Kokua Council and Hui 'Oia'i'o support SB2421 SD1, the repeal of the sunset provision of Act 195, to permanently codify amendments to Hawaii Revised Statutes 514B-105, 514B-146, and 667-94.

Act 195 rectified the "pay first, dispute later" provision so that it applies only to common expense assessments, thus returning some semblance of due process for condo owners who disagreed with the assessment of NON-essential fees or penalties.

Act 195 prohibited the harmful scheme which allowed NON-essential fees to be carved from fully and timely paid maintenance fees, which caused owners to appear to be deficient on their maintenance fee payments, and which allowed associations to foreclose on owners who were not in default on their maintenance fees but may have wanted to dispute a false House Rules violation or a wrongly imposed late fee penalty.

For these reasons, Hui 'Oia'i'o and Kokua Council support the passage of SB2421 SD1 which will make Act 195 permanent and protect condo owners from that aggressive collection method which destroyed many lives.
