#### RELATING TO THE HAWAII TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) offers comments on Senate Bill (S.B.) No. 2546.

S.B. No. 2546 establishes the Division of Aerospace Development (DAD) within the Hawai'i Technology Development Corporation (HTDC); transfers all rights, powers, functions, and duties of the Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism's (DBEDT) Office of Aerospace Development (OAD) and Pacific International Space Center for Exploration Systems (PISCES) to DAD; provides for the transfer of employees; repeals OAD and PISCES within DBEDT; establishes the Division of Aerospace Development Special Fund (DADSF); establishes the Hawai'i Broadband Office (HBO) within HTDC; and appropriates an unspecified amount of general funds for FY 21 to establish HBO.

Funds from the DADSF will be used for the operation, maintenance, and management of DAD projects, facilities, services, and publications. Funds may also be used for the design and construction of new facilities and for the renovation of or

Revenues for the fund would be derived from revenues, moneys, and fees from services, rentals, publications, royalties, and patents generated; gifts, donations, and grants received by the division; and proceeds from revenue bonds issued by the Director of Finance.

As a matter of general policy, B&F does not support the creation of any special fund which does not meet the requirements of Section 37-52.3, HRS. Special funds should: 1) serve a need as demonstrated by the purpose, scope of work and an explanation why the program cannot be implemented successfully under the general fund appropriation process; 2) reflect a clear nexus between the benefits sought and charges made upon the users or beneficiaries or a clear link between the program and the sources of revenue; 3) provide an appropriate means of financing for the program or activity; and 4) demonstrate the capacity to be financially self-sustaining. Regarding S.B. No. 2546, it is difficult to determine whether the proposed special fund would be self-sustaining.

B&F defers to DBEDT and HTDC regarding the operational impact of this measure.
