Aloha, Chair Rhoads, Vice Chair Keolokalole, and Members of the Committee,

The HAWAI'I REEF AND OCEAN COALITION – HIROC – was formed in 2017 by coral reef scientists, educators, local Hawaii environmental organizations, elected officials, and others to address a crisis facing Hawaii's coral reefs and ocean – namely, the pollution of our near-shore environment by sunscreens that are literally killing our marine life. We are currently asking the Legislature to pass a handful of very important bills to save our coral reefs – they are bills relating to sunscreens, plus bills on cesspools, plastic marine debris, the climate crisis and sea-level rise, and fishing of species important for reef and ocean health.

One especially harmful type of marine debris is balloons filled with gases lighter than air, which often end up in the ocean in Hawaii. Sea birds, turtles, and marine mammals are often killed by ingesting balloons they think are food or by getting tangled on attached ribbons. Balloons, like other plastics, absorb and release persistent organic pollutants, toxic chemicals that adversely affect the health and longevity of marine organisms. In short, these gas-filled balloons are toxic to marine life and should not be sold in Hawaii. Please pass this bill. Thank you for the opportunity to testify.

RE: **TESTIMONY IN VERY STRONG SUPPORT OF SB2781** Relating to litter control. Prohibits the intentional release of balloons. Committee meeting on Thursday 27th February, 2020 at 10:30AM

Aloha Chair Rhoads, Vice-Chair Keohokalole and Committee Members,

I am writing on behalf of Beach Environmental Awareness Campaign Hawai'i (B.E.A.C.H.) in very strong support of SB2781 which will ban intentional balloon releases throughout Hawai'i. Thank you to Senator Gabbard for introducing this bill and to the Committee on Agriculture and the Environment for passing it.

Releasing balloons is littering. This type of litter is one of the most harmful there is to marine life. Sea turtles, albatrosses and other marine life that eat squid and jellyfish can mistake a balloon in the ocean for food. Please see attached photos of balloons found at the beach and in the water. When balloons are ingested they cause blockages of the gastro-intestinal tract that then leads to starvation and death. The plastic ribbon attached to balloons is also a danger as it can cause injury or death to marine life that become entangled in it or ingest it.

It is unnecessary to release balloons into the air for celebration or commemoration of events. There are many other non-lethal ways to celebrate such as planting a tree, giving a lei or lighting a candle. B.E.A.C.H. has found that balloon litter on beaches increases particularly around May and June which indicates that the litter originates locally most likely from balloons released at graduation. One of our B.E.A.C.H. members was saddened to see a group of people celebrating graduation come out of a restaurant and release balloons into the air. A law in Hawai'i is needed to stop this from happening.

A number of states have passed laws related to balloon releases including California, Connecticut, Florida, Tennessee and Virginia. Several cities have also passed laws including San Francisco and Baltimore.

Hawai'i is a state surrounded by water and therefore it is imperative that action is taken to prevent one of the most hazardous types of litter from getting into the ocean and becoming marine debris. SB2781 will achieve the goal of preventing balloon litter.

Thank you for this opportunity to provide written testimony in very strong support of SB2781. Please pass this bill as is. Mahalo!

# Why Are Latex Balloons Dangerous?

Latex balloons are one of the most dangerous and life-threatening items for people with latex allergy. Latex balloons are coated in powder that helps latex proteins become airborne, inhaled and can cause a severe allergic reaction. Latex proteins are smaller than pollen so the body cannot filter them out before they reach the lungs. The level of latex proteins in balloons is extremely high compared to other latex products. Due to this, many hospitals and schools now ban latex balloons.

- Latex protein levels in powder-free latex gloves are approximately 5 parts per mL
- Latex protein levels in a single latex balloon are approximately 4700 parts per mL! (Yunginger JW, et al. J Allergy Clin Immunol. 1994)

What is latex allergy? Latex allergy is a serious, progressive, potentially life-threatening allergic condition. People with latex allergy can be diagnosed with allergic contact dermatitis (Type IV latex allergy) or the more severe, immediate hypersensitivity (Type I), or both Type IV and Type I. People can be exposed by direct contact, inhalation, or indirect contact. Each exposure can advance a latex allergy to make the person more seriously reactive. Even if a balloon is not touched it can cause a severe allergic reaction. Latex allergy is incurable.

What are the symptoms of a latex reaction? Reactions and symptoms can range from mild to life-threatening. They can include, but are not limited to any of the following:

- Skin/Eyes: Redness, swelling, rash, itching, hives, lesions
- Throat: Hoarse, difficulty swallowing, swelling
- Lungs: Coughing, wheezing, difficulty breathing, chest tightness
- Gut: nausea, vomiting, diarrhea
- Anaphylactic Shock: low blood pressure, obstructed breathing, heart failure and death

**Who is at risk?** Up to 6% of the general population have a latex allergy (CDC). Latex allergy is caused by repeated exposure to natural rubber latex. Those most at risk are people with any allergy (esp. bananas, avocado, kiwi, chestnuts); asthma; eczema; spina bifida; a history of multiple surgeries; occupational exposure (healthcare, food service, military); and the elderly.

**PLEASE HELP KEEP US SAFE FROM LATEX BALLOON EXPOSURE!** By the time a latex allergic person can see a balloon, they may have already been exposed to a potentially life-threatening level of airborne latex proteins. Please do not release balloons and choose latex free alternatives for decorating and events.

I am writing in support of HAWII SB2781. Intentional balloon releases are not only a danger to animals and the environment, they are also a danger to 1-6% of us with with latex allergies.

I have a severe airborne and contact latex allergy. One latex balloon has the potential to cause me to have an anaphylactic allergic reaction, and I don't even have to touch it. If there is a balloon or has been a balloon in my air space, for example stuck in a tree or caught on a sign, I immediately become hoarse, I develop itchy red eczema around my eyes and behind my ears, my chest hurts, my blood pressure drops, and I become lightheaded. I have to carry epinephrine, benadryl and a rescue inhaler at all times.

Please consider those of us with diagnosed latex allergies as well as those with undiagnosed latex allergies, especially children, and adopt a policy banning the intentional release of balloons inflated with a gas lighter than air. Latex allergy is life threatening, progressive, and preventable.
