SENATE BILL NO. 3031 RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Dear Chairs Keohokalole and Thielen, Vice Chairs English and Inouye, and members of the committee:

The Office of Enterprise Technology Services (ETS) **supports this bill with comments.** The objective of this bill, which requires the department of accounting and general services and the department of budget and finance, in consultation with the office of enterprise technology services, to develop and implement a uniform financial database, is already part of the executive budget request and therefore the bill may be unnecessary.

The executive budget request for the modernization of the State's financial management system, is included in HB 2200, Relating to the State Budget. HB 2200 includes capital improvement program (CIP) projects for AGS 130 (K-3):

A new State enterprise finance system will integrate all business management functions within a complex government environment, including accounting and finance, inventory management, purchasing, treasury, budgeting and more. It will implement a full-featured financial backbone that significantly expands the State's ability to report the level of detail for budgeting, appropriation management, financial reporting, and meet current compliance standards for accounting. The State will work to leverage a uniform financial application for all Executive

Branch departments and potentially extend services to agencies or jurisdictions who may be in similar risk situations with their fragility of their legacy-based finance applications and systems.

RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY.

Chairs Keohokalole and Thielen, Vice Chairs English and Inouye, and members of the Committees, thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony in **support** of S.B. 3031 and provide comments.

S.B. 3031 provides for the Department of Accounting and General Services (DAGS) and the Department of Budget and Finance, in consultation with the Office of Enterprise Technology Services, to develop and implement a uniform financial database for use by all state agencies, with features compatible to software systems currently in use.

The executive supplemental budget request, H.B. 2200, for fiscal biennium (F.B.) 2019-2021, which amends Act 5, SLH 2019 (the General Appropriations Act of 2019), and other budget authorizations effective during F.B. 2019-2021, includes a DAGS capital improvement project, the Hawaii Modernization Initiative. This request funds the plans, designs, construction

and equipment for the state finance system under AGS130, Enterprise Technology Services – Governance and Innovation:

Purpose of Bill: Requires the department of accounting and general services and the

department of budget and finance, in consultation with the office of enterprise technology services, to develop and implement a uniform financial database, with parameters, benefits, and features that are compatible to the software system currently being implemented by the office of enterprise technology services at other agencies for use by all

state agencies. Appropriates funds.

Department's Position:

RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) offers comments on the development of a uniform financial database for use by all State agencies.

Senate Bill (S.B.) No. 3031 requires the Department of Accounting and General Services (DAGS) and B&F, in consultation with the Office of Enterprise Technology Services (ETS), to develop and implement a uniform financial database with parameters, benefits and features that are compatible to the software system currently being implemented by ETS at other agencies, for use by all State agencies; requires DAGS and B&F to ensure that all Executive Branch departments participate at the appropriated phase of the development and implementation of the system; requires DAGS and B&F to submit a report to the Legislature that includes, but is not limited to, an implementation schedule, status of the initiative, amount and allocation of appropriated funds, sufficiency of resource commitments and organization problems and solutions; and appropriates an unspecified amount of general funds for FY 21 to be

expended by DAGS and B&F for the development and implementation of a uniform financial database.

While B&F supports the intent of the measure, we would like to note that the Executive Supplemental Budget includes a request for \$17,000,000 in general obligation bonds for FY 21 for DAGS-ETS to modernize and replace all the State's financial management systems for the Executive Branch.
