Dear Chair Rhoads, Vice Chair Keohokalole, and Members of the Committee,

Matson strongly supports SB3176, SD1, Relating to Motor Vehicle Registration. This measure requires that any authorization by a county director of finance for electronic motor vehicle registration shall apply to all motor vehicles and intermodal equipment.

Currently, only personal motor vehicles are able to submit electronically registration documents to the State and the respective county. Registration for all other types of motor vehicles requires submission of paper documents. The means of accepting electronic registration documents are already in place.

Allowing electronic registration for all types of motor vehicles, including shipping container chassis, would enable the State, counties, and companies like Matson to save time and cost.

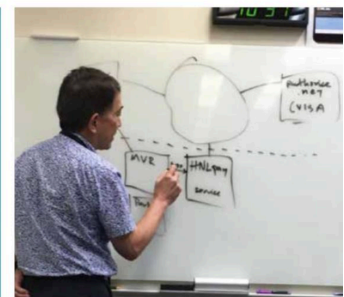
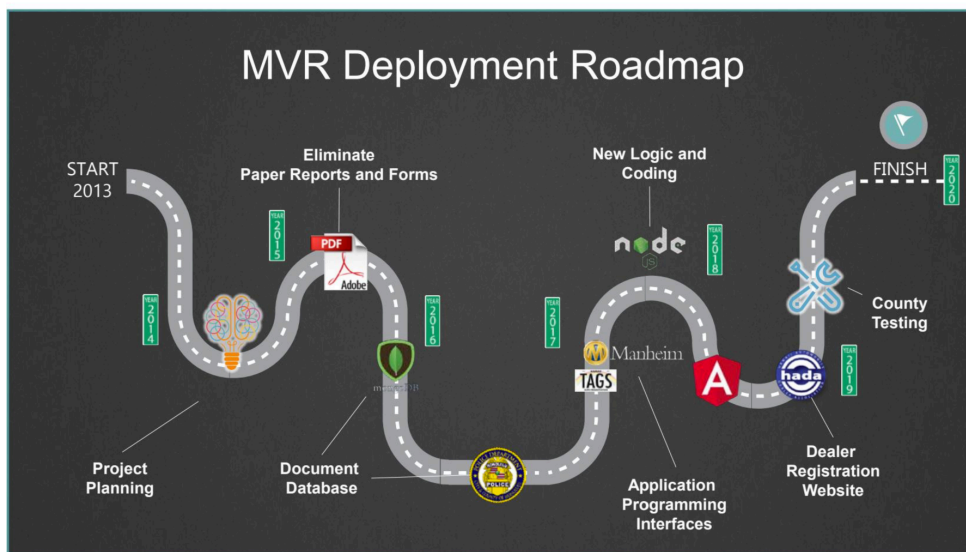

Mark, who has led a couple dozen briefings, and put in countless hours of programming, will make a presentation at the HADA convention on Maui on the soon-to-be-completed system.

HADA members believe SB3176, SD1 will help facilitate the transition to eReg and eTitling and request that the committee pass the bill on to its next committee for favorable consideration.
