## Testimony COMMENTING on SB0327, SD1 RELATING TO PRIVATE ROADS

## SENATOR DONOVAN M. DELA CRUZ, CHAIR COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

- 1 **Fiscal Implications:** No funding is provided to implement this measure and the Department
- 2 defers to the Governor's Supplemental Budget Request for appropriation priorities.
- 3 **Department Testimony:** The Department of Health (Department) offers comments on this
- 4 measure as the lack of ownership and maintenance of roads in former industrial areas may pose a hazard
- 5 to children's health when the pavement is in disrepair and contaminated soils under roadways become
- 6 exposed.
- 7 DOH investigates sources of contamination and works with land owners to prevent exposures under
- 8 HRS 128D. Properly maintained road surfaces provide a protective barrier to prevent direct contact with
- 9 potentially contaminated soils. In 2017, while investigating potential childhood lead exposures, DOH
- 10 identified lead contamination in subsurface soils at Factory Street in Kalihi and took an emergency action
- to provide temporary patching to potholes in the road surface to limit incidental contact by small children
- in the adjacent housing. Because this road is designated as abandoned, neither the City nor the property
- 13 owners are currently maintaining the road surface. Establishing ownership of Factory Street will
- re-institute routine maintenance of the roadway surface, creating a protective barrier that will protect the
- community into the future.
