### Chair Lee and Members of the Committee:

The Department of the Attorney General provides the following comments.

The purpose of this bill is to transfer unclaimed funds totaling \$10 or less in the Unclaimed Property Trust Fund to the Libraries Special Fund upon the expiration of a five-year time period. In addition, this bill amends the escheat provisions for unclaimed property sums of less than \$250.

We believe that this bill is subject to challenge as being in violation of section 14 of article III of the Hawaii State Constitution, which requires: "Each law shall embrace but one subject, which shall be expressed in its title." The subject expressed in the title of this bill is the "State Library System." However, the substance of section 2 of the bill deals with amending the unclaimed property statute. Section 2 of this bill is not within the subject of the "State Library System" that is expressed in its title and violates section 14 of article III of the Hawaii State Constitution. This constitutional infirmity can be cured by placing the contents of this bill in a bill with an appropriate title.

We respectfully ask the Committee to consider our comments.

### RELATING TO STATE LIBRARY SYSTEM

Senate Bill No. 978, S.D. 1, H.D. 1, specifies funds of \$10 or less in the unclaimed property trust fund shall escheat to the State and transferred to the libraries special fund upon expiration of a five-year time limitation. The bill also increases the threshold for escheatment of unclaimed funds to the general fund from amounts less than \$100 to amounts less than \$250 after the expiration of a five-year time limitation.

The Department is providing comments on this bill. Currently, Section 523A-19, HRS, already establishes a ten-year time limitation for owners to file a claim for funds \$100 or less deposited in the unclaimed property trust fund. These funds would escheat to the State upon expiration of the ten-year time limitation. Please note that while increasing the threshold amount from \$100 to less than \$250 to escheat to the State, escheatment and transfer of unclaimed funds of \$10 or less to the libraries special fund may result in a loss of revenue to the general fund.

While we appreciate the intent of the bill, as the fiduciary administering the Program's Trust Fund, we believe that it is in the better interest of the owners, their heirs, or beneficiaries to have access to file a claim for their funds within a reasonable time limitation which has been established at 10 years.
