# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LAND USE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that not only is climate
 change real, but it is the overriding challenge of the twenty first century and one of the priority issues of the legislature.
 Climate change poses immediate and long-term threats to the
 State's economy, sustainability, security, and way of life.

6 The legislature recognizes that eroding coastlines threaten
7 the State's assets that serve as critical infrastructure,
8 including the State's highway system.

9 The legislature also recognizes that the department of 10 transportation has completed the *State of Hawaii Statewide* 11 *Coastal Highway Program Report*, which utilized a methodology to 12 prioritize coastal roads threatened by coastal hazards and 13 climate change and identified segments of highway along Hauula 14 on Oahu as most critical.

15 The legislature further finds that the department of 16 transportation has had to conduct emergency repairs along 17 portions of the coastal highways in Hauula in April 2019 and



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again in January 2020, and that mid-term and long-term solutions
 must be identified to ensure that the public has access to safe,
 efficient, and sustainable transit corridors to enhance the
 mobility of people and goods and support economic vitality and
 livability.

6 The legislature finds that mid-term and long-term solutions
7 require land use planning that addresses economic, social,
8 public health, and environmental considerations to promote the
9 efficient use of resources for the future of the State.

10 The purpose of this Act is to identify climate adaptation 11 strategy options that address the impacts of coastal erosion on 12 coastal highways by:

13 (1) Requiring the office of planning to conduct a land use
14 study for Hauula, Oahu, that assesses the viability
15 and cost of maintaining the transit corridor,
16 including mid- and long-term adaptation strategies
17 associated with accommodating, protecting, and if
18 necessary, relocating, the corridor for the best
19 interest of the State; and

20 (2) Appropriating funds to the office of planning for the
21 purposes of this Act.

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SECTION 2. The office of planning shall conduct a land use
 study for Hauula, Oahu, that assesses the viability and cost of
 maintaining the transit corridor, including mid- and long-term
 adaptation strategies associated with accommodating, protecting,
 and if necessary, relocating, the corridor for the best interest
 of the State.

7 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for the 10 office of planning to conduct the land use study pursuant to 11 this Act.

12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of13 planning for the purposes of this Act.

14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
