RELATING TO VOTER REGISTRATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to conform the voter
2	registration deadline provision with Hawaiʻi's vote by mail
3	statutes by extending the voter registration deadline from
4	thirty days to fifteen days prior to each election.
5	SECTION 2. Section 11-15.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	"§11-15.2 [Late registration.] Same day in-person
8	registration. (a) Notwithstanding the closing of the general
9	county register pursuant to section 11-24, a person who is
10	[eligible to vote but is] not registered to vote may register by
11	appearing in person at any voter service center on or before
12	election day.
13	(b) The clerk shall designate a registration clerk[, who

14 may be an election official,] at each voter service center[.
15 (c) The registration clerk] who shall process applications
16 for any person [not registered to vote] who submits a signed

affidavit in accordance with section 11-15, which shall include 1 2 a sworn affirmation: 3 Of the person's qualification to vote; (1) Acknowledging that the person has not voted and will 4 (2) not attempt to vote again in that election, and has 5 6 not cast and will not cast any absentee ballot 7 pursuant to chapter 15 in that election; and 8 (3) Acknowledging that providing false information may 9 result in a class C felony, punishable by a fine not 10 exceeding [\$1,000] \$10,000 or imprisonment not exceeding five years, or both. 11 [(d)] (c) The registration clerk may accept, as prima 12 facie evidence, the allegation of the person in the application 13 regarding the person's residence in accordance with section 14 11-15(b), unless the allegation is contested by a qualified 15 16 voter. The registration clerk may demand that the person furnish substantiating evidence to the other allegations of the 17 person's application in accordance with section 11-15(b). 18 19 [(e) Registration may be challenged in accordance with

20 section 11-25.



1	(f) Notwithstanding subsection (a), registration pursuant
2	to this section may also be used by a person who is registered
3	to vote but whose name cannot be found on the county-register.
4	(g) The clerk of each county shall add persons who
5	properly register under this section to the respective general
6	county register. Within thirty days of registration, the clerk
7	shall mail to the person a notice including the person's name,
8	current street address, district, and date of registration. A
9	notice mailed pursuant to this subsection shall serve as prima
10	facie evidence that the person is a registered voter as of the
11	date of registration.]"
12	SECTION 3. Section 11-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended to read as follows:
14	"§11-24 Closing register. (a) At 4:30 p.m. on the
15	[thirtieth] <u>fifteenth</u> day prior to each [primary, special
16	primary, or special] election, but if the day is a Saturday,
17	Sunday, or holiday then at 4:30 p.m. on the first working day
18	immediately thereafter, the general county register shall be
19	closed to registration for persons seeking to vote [at the
20	primary, special primary, or special election] and remain closed
21	to registration until after the election, subject to change only

SECTION 4. Section 11-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 2 3 "(b) To the extent practicable, the clerk shall mail a ballot package by non-forwardable mail to each registered voter 4 5 in the county so as to enable voters to receive the ballot package approximately eighteen days before the election. The 6 clerk shall continue mailing ballot packages to voters who 7 8 register to vote no later than fifteen days before the date of 9 the election and to voters who update their voter registration 10 address no later than fourteen days before the date of the 11 election. The clerk may continue mailing ballot packages beyond the deadlines established by this subsection if the clerk 12 determines that there is reasonable time for a voter to receive 13 14 and submit the ballot package before the election. In 15 determining the initial mailing date of the ballot packages, the clerk shall consider the mailing place of origin and the most 16 17 recent postal service delivery standards. The clerk shall not 18 mail a ballot package to any voter in the county register who is identified as having an outdated or non-deliverable mailing 19 address. Nothing in this part shall be construed to change the 20 21 responsibilities of the clerk or chief election officer under

 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
