# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILDREN.

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### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that child abuse victims have as much a right to a speedy trial as do defendants. 2 The 3 speedy trial clause of the sixth amendment to the United States 4 Constitution provides in pertinent part as follows: "In all criminal prosecutions, the accused shall enjoy the right to a 5 speedy and public trial . . . " This is to protect the defendant 6 7 from delay between the presentation of the indictment or similar 8 charging instrument and the beginning of trial.

10 "Established by statute in 1965, the Family Court's mission is 11 to provide a fair, speedy, economical, and accessible forum for 12 the resolution of matters involving families and children." 13 (Emphasis added.) The legislature further finds that the term 14 "speedy" is not limited to the right to a speedy trial for adult 15 perpetrators of child abuse, but should also recognize a right 16 to a speedy trial for child abuse victims.

1 The purpose of this Act is to require an expedited 2 disposition of cases in all criminal proceedings involving abuse 3 of minors. 4 SECTION 2. Chapter 806, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 6 and to read as follows: 7 "§806- Expedited proceedings; continuances. (a) In any 8 criminal proceeding for a sexual offense under part V of chapter 9 707 perpetuated against a minor or child abuse under part VI of 10 chapter 707, the court and the prosecution shall set the case 11 for priority in the court docket, to ensure a prompt trial in 12 order to minimize the length of time a minor must endure the 13 stress of the minor's involvement in the proceedings. 14 (b) In deciding whether to grant a continuance, the court shall take into consideration the potential adverse impact the 15 16 delay may have on the minor's well-being; provided that a 17 continuance shall not be granted unless not doing so would result in a state or federal constitutional violation." 18 19 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored. 20 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
