A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII BOARD OF REGENTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the board of
 education has begun to webcast live streaming audio of its
 meetings. The board of regents of the University of Hawaii,
 however, has not instituted a similar practice with respect to
 its meetings.

6 The legislature further finds that when the federal Americans with Disabilities Act was signed into law in 1990, 7 8 webcasting and streaming video were not significant aspects of the cultural milieu in the United States. In 2010, a lawsuit 9 10 was brought against Netflix by the National Association of the Deaf, alleging that Netflix was discriminating against deaf and 11 12 hard-of-hearing viewers under the Americans with Disabilities Act because not all of their online streaming video had closed 13 14 captions. The defendant argued that their business practices 15 fell under the federal 21st Century Communications and Video 16 Accessibility Act instead of the Americans with Disabilities 17 The court found that these two laws are not mutually Act.

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1	exclusive. Compliance with the 21st Century Communications and
2	Video Accessibility Act does not necessarily preclude potential
3	legal action based on possible violations of the Americans with
4	Disabilities Act. As part of a consent decree, Netflix agreed
5	to caption one hundred per cent of their videos beginning in
6	2014. Because the case was settled by means of a consent decree
7	rather than a judicial ruling, there remains room for a
8	difference of legal opinion on the matter of online media
9	content accessibility under the Americans with Disabilities Act.
10	The purpose of this Act is to require the board of regents
11	of the University of Hawaii to:
12	(1) By May 1, 2021, begin livestreaming audio and
13	archiving on its website all board of regents standing
14	committee meetings;
15	(2) By September 1, 2021, begin livestreaming video and
16	archiving on its website all board of regents
17	meetings; and
18	(3) Move expeditiously to ascertain its obligations and
19	best practices that should be implemented in complying
20	with the Americans with Disabilities Act in regard to
21	the accessibility of webcasting and streaming video of

 standing committee meetings.

3 SECTION 2. Section 304A-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4 amended to read as follows:

5 "§304A-104 Regents; appointment; tenure; qualifications; 6 (a) The affairs of the university shall be under the meetings. 7 general management and control of the board of regents. The 8 board shall consist of eleven members who shall be appointed by 9 the governor from lists of qualified candidates presented to the governor by the candidate advisory council, pursuant to section 10 11 304A-104.6, and shall be confirmed by the senate; provided that if the list of qualified candidates includes fewer than three 12 13 candidates at any time during the nomination and confirmation 14 process, the governor may request that the candidate advisory council reopen recruitment for qualified candidates. Members 15 16 may be removed by the governor. Except as otherwise provided by 17 law, state officers shall be eligible for appointment and 18 membership.

19 The term of each member shall be five years, except as
20 provided for the initial appointment in section 26-11; provided
21 that the term of the student member shall be two years. Every

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1 member may serve beyond the expiration date of the member's term 2 of appointment as a holdover member until the member's successor 3 has been appointed by the governor and confirmed by the senate 4 in accordance with article X, section 6 of the Hawaii State 5 Constitution; provided that, notwithstanding any law to the 6 contrary, a holdover member shall not serve as a member of the 7 board beyond the end of the first regular session of the 8 legislature following the expiration of the member's term. 9 Members shall serve no more than two consecutive five-year 10 terms; provided that the members who are initially appointed to 11 terms of two years or less pursuant to section 26-11(a) may be 12 reappointed to two ensuing five-year terms. If a member is to 13 be appointed to a second term of five years, the senate shall 14 consider the question of whether to reconfirm the member at 15 least one hundred twenty days prior to the conclusion of a 16 member's first five-year term; provided that if the senate is 17 not in session within one hundred twenty days prior to the 18 conclusion of the member's first five-year term, the member shall continue to serve until the senate convenes for the next 19 20 regular session or the next special session for which the senate 21 is authorized to consider the question of reconfirmation.

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1 (b) In determining whether to confirm the governor's 2 nominee to the board of regents, the senate shall consider the 3 combination of abilities, breadth of experiences, and characteristics of the board of regents, as a whole, that will 4 best serve the diverse interests and needs of the students of 5 the university system and assist the university system in 6 7 achieving its strategic goals and performance indicators. The 8 senate shall consider whether the board reflects the diversity 9 of the student population, the various counties of the State, 10 and a broad representation of higher education-related 11 stakeholders.

12 (c) At its first meeting after June 30 of each year, the 13 board of regents shall elect a chairperson and one or more vice-14 chairpersons who shall serve until the adjournment of the first 15 meeting of the board of regents after June 30 of the next year, 16 or thereafter until their successors are elected; provided that 17 the chairperson and vice chairpersons shall not be elected prior 18 to the taking of office of regents whose terms shall begin on 19 July 1 of that year. The board shall appoint a secretary, who 20 shall not be a member of the board. The president of the 21 university shall act as executive officer of the board. A

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1	majority of the board of regents shall constitute a quorum to
2	conduct business, and the concurrence of a majority of all the
3	members to which the board of regents is entitled shall be
4	necessary to make any action of the board of regents valid. The
5	board shall meet at least ten times annually and, from time to
6	time, may meet in each of the counties of Hawaii, Maui, and
7	Kauai.
8	(d) All board of regents standing committee meetings shall
9	be:
10	(1) Recorded in live digital audio format by May 1, 2021;
11	and
12	(2) Archived and made available to the public on the board
13	of regents' website within one week after adjournment
14	of the meeting;
15	provided that the board of regents shall determine its
16	accessibility obligations under the Americans with Disabilities
17	Act of 1990, as amended, and bring its actions into compliance
18	therewith.
19	(e) All regular meetings of the board of regents shall be:
20	(1) Recorded in live digital video format;
21	(2) Webcast live by September 1, 2021; and



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1	(3) Archived and made available to the public on the board
2	of regents' website within one week after adjournment
3	of the meeting;
4	provided that the board of regents shall determine its
5	obligations under the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990,
6	as amended, concerning accessibility of webcasting and video
7	streaming of its meetings and bring its actions into compliance
8	therewith.
9	[(d)] <u>(f)</u> The governor shall notify the candidate advisory
10	council for the board of regents of the University of Hawaii in
11	writing within ten days of receiving notification that a member
12	of the board of regents is resigning or has died, or is being
13	removed by the governor.
14	[(e)] <u>(g)</u> The members of the board of regents shall serve
15	without pay but shall be entitled to their travel expenses
16	within the State when attending meetings of the board or when
17	actually engaged in business relating to the work of the board."
18	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
20	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

University of Hawaii; Board of Regents; Meetings; Public Access

Description:

Requires all public meetings of the board of regents to be recorded in live digital audio format by May 1, 2021, for standing committee meetings, and webcast live by September 1, 2021, for all regular board of regents meetings. Requires all recording to be archived and made available to the public. Requires the Board of Regents to determine its accessibility obligations pursuant to the Americans with Disabilities Act and comply with those obligations. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)
