# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. Section 26-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:  
3           "(a) Except as otherwise provided by law, the lieutenant  
4 governor is designated the secretary of state for  
5 intergovernmental relations and shall perform the duties and  
6 functions heretofore exercised by the secretary of Hawaii. The  
7 duties and functions shall include but not be limited to  
8 recordation of all legislative and gubernatorial acts,  
9 certification of state documents, [~~and~~] maintenance of an  
10 official file of rules adopted by state departments as provided  
11 in chapter 91[-], management and oversight of public tours of  
12 the state capitol, and maintenance and publication of a list of  
13 vacancies on state boards and commissions; provided that nothing  
14 in this section shall diminish the power of the governor to  
15 nominate persons to serve on a board or commission in accordance  
16 with the constitution and applicable state law. The lieutenant



1 governor may employ staff as necessary without regard to chapter  
2 76."

3 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
