
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE CAPITOL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 6E-34.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "~~[+]~~ §6E-34.5 ~~[+]~~ State capitol; state capitol management
4 committee; established; oversight and management; powers and
5 duties. (a) The oversight and management of the state capitol
6 and its grounds and facilities shall be vested in the state
7 capitol management committee established pursuant to this
8 section.

9 (b) There is established the state capitol management
10 committee, which shall be composed of the lieutenant governor,
11 who shall not be represented by a designee, and the following
12 members or their respective designees:

13 (1) The governor's chief of staff;

14 (2) The lieutenant governor's chief of staff;

15 ~~[+2]~~ (3) The comptroller;

16 ~~[+3]~~ (4) The director of public safety;



1 [~~(4)~~] (5) Two members of the senate as appointed by the
2 president of the senate;

3 [~~(5)~~] (6) Two members of the house of representatives as
4 appointed by the speaker of the house of
5 representatives;

6 [~~(6)~~] (7) A legislative officer of the senate appointed by
7 the president of the senate; and

8 [~~(7)~~] (8) A legislative officer of the house of
9 representatives appointed by the speaker of the house
10 of representatives;

11 provided that for members appointed pursuant to paragraphs [~~(6)~~]
12 (7) and [~~(7)~~], (8), "legislative officer" shall have the same
13 meaning as that term is defined in section 88-21.

14 The lieutenant governor shall serve as the chairperson of
15 the state capitol management committee [~~shall be elected by the~~
16 ~~committee members~~]. The department of accounting and general
17 services shall provide administrative support to the state
18 capitol management committee; provided that the committee shall
19 also receive fiscal analysis support from the department of
20 budget and finance as the committee deems appropriate.



1 (c) The state capitol management committee shall meet at
2 times and places as specified by a call of the chairperson or a
3 majority of the committee; provided that the committee shall
4 meet not less than four times per calendar year. The state
5 capitol management committee shall prescribe rules, which shall
6 not be subject to chapter 91, for its own management and
7 governance. Five members of the committee shall constitute a
8 quorum, and a quorum may exercise all the power and authority
9 conferred on the committee.

10 (d) When a vacancy occurs in the membership of the state
11 capitol management committee, the respective appointing
12 authority shall fill the vacancy within fourteen days.

13 (e) Members of the state capitol management committee
14 shall serve without pay, but shall be reimbursed for their
15 actual and necessary expenses, including travel expenses,
16 incurred in carrying out their duties.

17 (f) The state capitol management committee shall:

18 (1) Approve all policies and procedures relating to the
19 general operation and management of the state capitol
20 and its grounds and facilities, including parking,



1 building access, building operation hours, and general
2 security policies;

3 (2) Develop and recommend to the legislature capital
4 improvement, programmatic, and operational priorities
5 that require fiscal resources to maintain and enhance
6 the appearance and operation of the state capitol and
7 its grounds and facilities;

8 (3) Review and authorize the repair and maintenance
9 schedule for the state capitol, its grounds and
10 facilities, and any other capital improvement projects
11 relating to the upkeep, renovation, restoration, use,
12 and maintenance of the state capitol and its grounds
13 and facilities; and

14 (4) Review and authorize, but not execute, the expenditure
15 of any moneys appropriated to and allocated by the
16 department of budget and finance, accounting and
17 general services, or public safety for the state
18 capitol and its grounds and facilities.

19 (g) The lieutenant governor shall submit an annual report
20 to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the



1 convening of each regular session. The report shall include
2 the:

- 3 (1) Number of state capitol management committee meetings;
4 (2) Outcomes or actions of each state capitol management
5 committee meeting;
6 (3) Number and dollar amount of each state capitol
7 management committee expenditure; and
8 (4) Purpose of each state capitol management committee
9 expenditure."

10 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

12 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.



Report Title:

State Capitol Management Committee; Lieutenant Governor;
Lieutenant Governor's Chief of Staff; Membership

Description:

Increases the membership of the state capitol management committee by including the lieutenant governor and the lieutenant governor's chief of staff. Prohibits the lieutenant governor from being represented on the committee by a designee. Requires the lieutenant governor to submit an annual report to the legislature. (SD1)

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
