## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING ALL STATE DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES TO COOPERATE AND ASSIST KAHO'OLAWE ISLAND RESERVE COMMISSION WITH TECHNICAL, ENGINEERING, OR LOGISTICAL SUPPORT IN HELPING THE ISLAND OF KAHO'OLAWE TO RECOVER FROM THE DEVASTATING FIRE THAT BEGAN ON FEBRUARY 22, 2020.

WHEREAS, on February 22, 2020, a large brush fire ignited 1 2 on the western end of the island of Kaho'olawe; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the fire blazed for days, with Maui firefighting 5 crews unable to actively combat the fire because of the danger of unexploded ordnance still present on Kaho'olawe, including 6 rifle bullets and other munition from the over fifty years the 7 United States Navy used Kaho'olawe for bombing practice; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, since the United States Navy conveyed deed of 11 ownership of Kaho'olawe to the State of Hawaii in 1994, about sixty-five percent of the island has been cleared of surface 12 13 unexploded ordnance, while ten percent has been cleared to a depth of four feet; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, the remaining twenty-five percent of the island, or 6,690 acres, is uncleared; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, during the first days of the fire, the fire swept past Kaho'olawe Island Reserve Commission's base camp located on 20 21 the western end of the island; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the terrain on the western end of Kaho'olawe, 24 consisting of invasive non-native grasses and shrublands, made the highly fire-susceptible, non-native grasses contributing 25 factors to the extent and intensity of the Kahoolawe fire; and 26

1 WHEREAS, though Kaho'olawe Island Reserve Commission's 2 Honokanai'a base camp was initially spared from severe fire 3 damage, Kaho'olawe Island Reserve Commission's upland field 4 storage area suffered complete loss of several storage structures, including equipment, supplies, and materials that 5 6 were stored in the buildings; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the loss of several motor vehicles, construction 9 equipment, and all-terrain vehicles are especially worrisome 10 since those things are essential to maintain the island infrastructure and carry out Kaho'olawe Island Reserve 11 12 Commission's restoration efforts; and 13 14 WHEREAS, despite tradewinds that made extinguishing the 15 fire more difficult, after six days, heavy rains on Kaho'olawe began to douse and put out the fire; and 16 17 WHEREAS, all told, the Kaho'olawe fire burned about nine 18 19 thousand acres, or about one-third of the island of Kahoolawe; 20 and 21 22 WHEREAS, Kaho'olawe Island Reserve Commission now begins the 23 long road to recovery and restoring its ability to conduct 24 effective and long-term ecological restoration efforts on 25 Kaho'olawe; now, therefore, 26 27 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature 28 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of 29 Representatives concurring, that all state departments and agencies are urged to cooperate and assist Kaho'olawe Island 30 Reserve Commission with technical, engineering, or logistical 31 support in helping the island of Kaho'olawe to recover from the 32 devastating fire of February 22, 2020; and 33
