#### SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING THE SEVENTY-FIFTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE UNITED NATIONS; URGING ALL STATE AGENCIES TO IMPLEMENT EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 1806.

WHEREAS, in 1945, nations were in ruins, World War II was
 over, and the world wanted peace; fifty-one countries gathered
 in San Francisco that year on October 24, to sign a Charter,
 creating a new organization, the United Nations; and

6 WHEREAS, seventy-five years later, the United Nations 7 continues to help build a better world as envisioned by its 8 founders, maintaining international peace and security by 9 upholding international law, protecting human rights, and 10 promoting democracy; and

WHEREAS, in celebration of the seventy-fifth anniversary, on June 14, 2019, the United Nations General Assembly adopted a Resolution to commemorate the seventy-fifth anniversary of the establishment of the United Nations under the theme, "The future we want, the United Nations we need: reaffirming our collective commitment to multilateralism"; and

19 WHEREAS, the initiative is described as a "global reality 20 check" to spark conversations around building a better future 21 for all by revitalizing multilateralism, strengthening the 22 United Nations, respecting international laws and reaffirming 23 the Charter of the United Nations, consistent with the agenda of 24 a more prosperous and peaceful world, and pledge to leave no one 25 behind; and

WHEREAS, by tackling issues such as the climate crisis,
inequality, new patterns of violence, and the major changes seen
in population and technology, the implementation of the
Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), otherwise known as the
2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, born at the United



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Nations Conference in Rio de Janeiro, requires cooperation 1 across borders, sectors, and generations; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the seventeen SDGs are interconnected and work in 4 the spirit of partnership and pragmatism to make the right 5 choices now to improve life, in a sustainable way, for future 6 generations; they provide a global roadmap for the future we 7 want, defend the sovereign equality of the nations and the free 8 self-determination of the peoples, and breathe life into 9 multilateralism in order to reflect the values of the United 10 Nations; and 11 12 WHEREAS, during September 2016, over ten thousand leaders 13 from government, civil society, indigenous communities, faith 14 and spiritual traditions, the private sector, and academia 15 gathered in Hawai'i for a meeting of the International Union for 16 Conservation of Nature World Conservation Congress where the 17 delegates adopted the World Conservation Congress Hawai'i 18 Commitments to achieve the transformation required to promote a 19 "Culture of Conservation"; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, the Hawai'i Commitments build on the Paris Climate Agreement and the SDGs to allow different global voices to come 23 together and find common ground in the spirit of partnership, 24 25 collaboration, and sustainability; and 26 WHEREAS, the Senate adopted the seventeen SDGs during the 27 Regular Session of 2018; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the Governor executed Executive Order No. 1806 on 30 November 30, 2018, authorizing, directing, and ordering that all 31 departments of the State of Hawai'i implement practices and take 32 action to assist the State in achieving the SDGs by the year 33 34 2030; and 35 WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 1806 has been adopted by the 36 City and County of Honolulu, Hawai'i County, Kaua'i County, and 37 38 Maui County; and 39 WHEREAS, in order for Hawai'i to continue to serve as a 40 starlight for the rest of the world in setting policies on 41



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issues of sustainability and conservation, it is essential that 1 the State demonstrate its full commitment to its own policies 2 3 and goals as well as the goals set on the international stage at 4 United Nations conferences and summits; now, therefore, 5 6 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of 7 Representatives concurring, that in recognition and celebration 8 of the seventy-fifth anniversary of the United Nations, all 9 state agencies are urged to implement Executive Order No. 1806 10 to assist the State in achieving the United Nations SDGs and 11 indicators by 2030; and 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all state agencies are 14 requested to take broad acceleration to specifically achieve the 15 following: 16 17 No poverty. End poverty in all its forms (1) Goal 1. 18 everywhere; 19 20 Zero hunger. End hunger, achieve food (2) Goal 2. 21 security and improved nutrition, and promote 22 sustainable agriculture; 23 24 25 (3) Goal 3. Good health and well-being. Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages; 26 27 28 (4)Goal 4. Quality education. Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong 29 learning opportunities for all; 30 31 (5) Goal 5. Gender equality. Achieve gender equality and 32 empower all women and girls; 33 34 (6) Goal 6. Clean water and sanitation. Ensure 35 availability and sustainable management of water and 36 sanitation for all; 37 38 (7) Goal 7. Affordable and clean energy. Ensure access 39 to affordable, reliable, sustainable, and modern 40 energy for all; 41 42


