# SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING PARTICIPATION IN THE COMMEMORATION OF THE SEVENTY-FIFTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE UNITED NATIONS.

1           WHEREAS, in 1945, nations were in ruins, World War II was  
2 over, and the world wanted peace; fifty-one countries gathered  
3 in San Francisco that year on October 24, to sign a Charter,  
4 creating a new organization, the United Nations; and  
5

6           WHEREAS, for seventy-five years, the United Nations has  
7 committed to help build a better world as envisioned by its  
8 founders, and serves as a beacon of light for multilateralism,  
9 international peace and security, human rights, social and  
10 economic well-being, and diplomacy; and  
11

12           WHEREAS, the active participation of global civil society,  
13 governments, and world leaders is an essential component for the  
14 continued inclusiveness, problem-solving, collaborative goal  
15 setting, effectiveness, and durability of the United Nations,  
16 and fulfillment of the United Nations' Sustainable Development  
17 Goals (SGDs) by 2030; and  
18

19           WHEREAS, in celebration of the seventy-fifth anniversary,  
20 on June 14, 2019, the United Nations General Assembly adopted a  
21 Resolution to commemorate the seventy-fifth anniversary of the  
22 establishment of the United Nations under the theme, "The future  
23 we want, the United Nations we need: reaffirming our collective  
24 commitment to multilateralism"; and  
25

26           WHEREAS, Hawaii enthusiastically supports the United  
27 Nations commitment to implementation of major global campaigns  
28 from the Paris Agreement and the SGDs by 2030; and

30           WHEREAS, Hawaii was proposed as a potential host for the  
31 United Nations headquarters to serve as a diplomatic hub for all  
32 humanity; and

1           WHEREAS, in order for Hawaii to continue to serve as a  
2 starlight for the rest of the world in setting policies on  
3 issues of sustainability and conservation, it is essential that  
4 the State demonstrate its full commitment to the goals set on  
5 the international stage by United Nations conferences and  
6 summits; and  
7

8           WHEREAS, the Hawaii State Legislature recognizes its  
9 important role in promoting and supporting the principles,  
10 unique mission, and indispensable work of the United Nations in  
11 order to address the most pressing issues facing humanity both  
12 globally and locally; now, therefore,  
13

14           BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature  
15 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of  
16 Representatives concurring, that the Legislature encourages the  
17 citizens of Hawaii to participate in the commemoration of the  
18 seventy-fifth anniversary of the United Nations; and  
19

20           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature appeals to  
21 members of the United States Congress, State and local public  
22 officials, civic leaders, educational institutions, the media,  
23 and the general public to support the principles and vital work  
24 of the United Nations; and

26           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature encourages  
27 robust participation and continued leadership of the Government  
28 of the United States of America as well as local state and  
29 county government in fulfillment of United Nations programs and  
30 goals to build a better and sustainable world for all peoples  
31 locally, nationally, and globally; and

33           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
34 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Majority Leader of  
35 the United States Senate; Speaker of the United States House of  
36 Representatives; Hawaii's congressional delegation; Governor of  
37 the State of Hawaii; President of the Senate; Speaker of the  
38 House of Representatives; Comptroller; Chairperson of the Board  
39 of Agriculture; Attorney General; Director of Finance; Director  
40 of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism; Director of  
41 Commerce and Consumer Affairs; Adjutant General; Chairperson of  
42 the Board of Education; Superintendent of Education; Chairperson



