SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DISABILITY AND COMMUNICATION ACCESS BOARD, IN
COLLABORATION WITH THE OFFICE OF ENTERPRISE TECHNOLOGY
SERVICES, TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP ON ACCESSIBLE
GOVERNMENT DOCUMENTS.

1 WHEREAS, an accessible document is a document created to be
2 as easily readable by a sighted reader as a low-vision or
3 non-sighted reader; and
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5 WHEREAS, accessible documents allow individuals who use
6 screen readers to navigate through the document, utilize the
7 properties to move from one part of a document to another, hear
8 descriptions of photographs and images from image tags, and have
9 equal access to the information; and
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11 WHEREAS, public agencies that are required to provide
12 accessible documents do not always have staff that understand
13 how to make the information accessible; and
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15 WHEREAS, the increasing use of technology to communicate
16 can also present complications and challenges, such as the
17 various state agency websites that post public meeting notices,
18 agendas, and attached resource documents that may not
19 necessarily all be in accessible formats, especially when
20 attachments are scanned copies; and
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22 WHEREAS, the State's Disability and Communication Access
23 Board serves as the public advocate of persons with disabilities
24 by providing advice and recommendations on matters relating to
25 access, with an emphasis on state and county legislative matters
26 and administrative rules, policies, and procedures, and also
27 provides technical assistance and guidance to state and county
28 entities to meet state, federal, and county requirements for
29 access for persons with disabilities; and
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1 WHEREAS, the State's Office of Enterprise Technology
2 Services, headed by the Chief Information Officer, is charged
3 with organizing, managing, and overseeing statewide information
4 technology governance, including establishing, coordinating, and
5 managing a program to provide a means for public access to
6 public information and developing and operating an information
7 network; now, therefore,

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9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature
10 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of
11 Representatives concurring, that the Disability and
12 Communication Access Board, in collaboration with the Office on
13 Enterprise Technology Services, is requested to convene a
14 working group on accessible government documents; and

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16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group:

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18 (1) Research other states' laws and use technologies to
19 provide government documents, including documents
20 provided by private entities under contract with the
21 State, in accessible formats;

23 (2) Evaluate and recommend strategies to improve the
24 provision of government documents, including documents
25 provided by private entities under contract with the
26 State, in accessible formats, including identifying
27 means for effective and efficient oversight; and

29 (3) Make recommendations to the Legislature about how to
30 further the policy of providing accessible government
31 documents; and
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33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a representative of the
34 Disability and Communication Access Board and representative of
35 the Office of Enterprise Technology Services are requested to
36 serve as co-chairs of the working group and invite one
37 representative from each of the following entities to serve as
38 working group members:

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26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Disability and
27 Communication Access Board is requested to submit a report on
28 behalf of the working group of its findings and recommendations,
29 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later
30 than forty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of
31 2021; and

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33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the working
34 group serve without compensation; and

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36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
37 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Lieutenant Governor,
38 Attorney General, Comptroller, Director of Health, Chair of the
39 Disability and Communication Access Board, Chief Information
40 Officer, Administrative Director of the Courts, Chief Clerk of
41 the House of Representatives, Director of the Center on
42 Disability Studies, Director of the Office of Information
