SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH'S DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES
DIVISION TO FIND A SOURCE OF FUNDING TO SUBSIDIZE THE
DEVELOPMENT OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING FOR PEOPLE WITH
INTELLECTUAL AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES.

1 WHEREAS, individuals with developmental disabilities are
2 disproportionately low-income and are often being priced out of
3 many neighborhoods, especially in urban areas, as rental prices
4 continue to increase and affordable housing options diminish;
5 and

7 WHEREAS, individuals with developmental disabilities
8 compete with the general population with regard to housing; and

9
10 WHEREAS, some of these individuals rely on Supplemental
11 Security Income, which is the federal income maintenance program
12 that assists people with significant and long-term disabilities
13 who have no assets and no other source of income, to meet their
14 basic needs; and

15
16 WHEREAS, the Supplemental Security Income payment is
17 insufficient to cover the cost of renting a studio unit in the
18 State, especially in areas where many necessary services are
19 available; and

20
21 WHEREAS, because of the disparity between the Supplemental
22 Security Income payment and high housing costs, individuals with
23 developmental disabilities are often forced into homelessness or
24 segregated, restrictive, and costly institutional living
25 arrangements; and

27 WHEREAS, in light of the inadequate federal resources for
28 supporting individuals with developmental disabilities with
29 appropriate housing, it is critical to identify opportunities
30 for supplementing support at the state level; now, therefore,

1 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature
 2 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of
 3 Representatives concurring, that the Department of Health's
 4 Developmental Disabilities Division is requested to identify
 5 potential sources of funding to subsidize the development of
 6 affordable housing for people with intellectual and
 7 developmental disabilities; and

 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Developmental Disabilities
 10 Division is urged to submit a report of its findings and
 11 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
 12 Legislature prior to the convening of the Regular Session of
 13 2021; and

 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
 16 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and
 17 Director of Health.
