# SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND THE COUNTIES TO  
REEVALUATE CURRENT CROSSWALK LOCATIONS AND THE NEED FOR NEW  
CROSSWALKS.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii has too many cases of pedestrian deaths and  
2 injuries occurring as a result of being struck in crosswalks;  
3 and  
4

5 WHEREAS, in 2018, Hawaii had over forty pedestrian  
6 fatalities, which was the highest pedestrian fatality rate in  
7 the United States; and  
8

9 WHEREAS, pedestrian crosswalk safety is such an important  
10 community issue that in 2008, the University of Hawaii published  
11 a study entitled "Modeling Violation of Hawaii's Crosswalk Law"  
12 to analyze the issue; and  
13

14 WHEREAS, the same University of Hawaii study found that  
15 disproportionately more drivers than pedestrians violate the  
16 crosswalk law, with the most common violation being not stopping  
17 for pedestrians who are in the crosswalk, followed by stopping  
18 but continuing to proceed before the pedestrian has left the  
19 crosswalk; now, therefore,  
20

21 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature  
22 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, that this body  
23 hereby requests the Department of Transportation and respective  
24 counties to work together to study the effectiveness of current  
25 crosswalk locations and the need for new crosswalks; and

27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that roadways with higher pedestrian  
28 traffic or those that have experienced higher rates of  
29 pedestrian accidents are to be prioritized for study; and  
30

31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of  
32 Transportation is requested to submit a report of its findings  
33 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation to the  
34 Legislature, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of  
35 the Regular Session of 2021; and
