# SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR TO CREATE A COLOR-CODED ADVISORY SYSTEM TO  
ADDRESS THE RAPIDLY CHANGING THREAT OF COVID-19.

1           WHEREAS, considering the recent developments regarding  
2 COVID-19, or novel coronavirus, which causes a mild to severe  
3 respiratory illness, and the increasing danger it poses to our  
4 public; and

5  
6           WHEREAS, the government of the State of Hawaii has a duty  
7 to inform and protect its citizens; and

8  
9           WHEREAS, constituents have many questions based on a lack  
10 of information, and it is imperative to not only promote healthy  
11 hygiene and social distancing, but to also take steps to assure  
12 the public clearly understands the level of threat our  
13 communities face; and

14  
15           WHEREAS, the President of the United States has announced a  
16 travel ban on persons arriving from Europe; and

17  
18           WHEREAS, countries around the world are implementing  
19 procedures to combat and attempt to control the threat and  
20 spread of COVID-19. For example, Saudi Arabia is restricting  
21 travel to holy sites; South Korea is implementing quarantines  
22 enforced by criminal charge; Northern Italy is imposing army-  
23 guarded lockdowns of its towns, schools, and universities; China  
24 has implemented lockdowns of its cities, travel, and other  
25 public venues; Japan has closed its schools; France has  
26 requested its citizens to abandon the traditional "bise"  
27 greeting and banned public gatherings of five thousand people or  
28 more; Iran has suspended its parliament; and Switzerland has  
29 banned gatherings of more than one thousand people; and

31           WHEREAS, counties and states across our nation are calling  
32 for, or have already declared states of emergency, with the  
33 states of California, Florida, and Washington having already  
34 declared a state of emergency; and

2 WHEREAS, Mayors of Kauai, Maui, and Honolulu have already  
3 issued separate proclamations of emergency to combat the threat  
4 of COVID-19; and

5  
6 WHEREAS, government agencies, such as the Department of  
7 Defense and other states, such as Washington, have already  
8 implemented tiered response protocols; and

9  
10 WHEREAS, Hawaii state government needs to present a  
11 unified, cohesive response in the form of a singular,  
12 universally applicable tiered response protocol that informs the  
13 public and state agencies alike of both the current threat level  
14 posed by COVID-19 and the government's according response; and

15  
16 WHEREAS, the Department of Homeland Security has previously  
17 implemented a color-coded advisory system used to communicate  
18 risk levels for previous threats to the public's health and  
19 welfare that is easily understood by and familiar to the public;  
20 and

21  
22 WHEREAS, this previously used advisory system requires  
23 clear details in the context of the current situation to be  
24 effective; and

25  
26 WHEREAS, the risk posed by COVID-19 can rapidly change,  
27 necessitating a system that can be quickly adjusted to reflect  
28 the level of risk posed by COVID-19 as well as the appropriate  
29 responses to the various risk levels; and

30  
31 WHEREAS, this previously used system provides a means for  
32 the government to quickly and easily inform the public of  
33 updates to the situation and to plan appropriately in the event  
34 of changing risk levels; now, therefore,

35  
36 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature  
37 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, that the  
38 Governor is urged to create a color-coded advisory system  
39 consistent with the system previously developed and used by the  
40 Department of Homeland Security to address the rapidly changing  
41 threat of COVID-19; and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor, Department of  
2 Health, and HIEMA are requested to coordinate with the  
3 appropriate government agencies to create a single, unified  
4 system that will inform the public and agencies alike of the  
5 standing threat level and according government restrictions,  
6 protocols and policies; and  
7

8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the risk advisory levels could  
9 be denoted as follows:  
10

11 (1) Red - Severe, indicating widespread community  
12 transmission, spread is ongoing, the majority of the  
13 islands in the State are involved, and recommended  
14 actions to be taken include:  
15

16 (A) Continue all measures from the prior risk level;  
17

18 (B) Consider restriction of movement, including  
19 quarantines, isolations, cancelation of public  
20 gatherings, avoiding congregate settings, and  
21 practicing social distancing;  
22

23 (C) Access to public installations are limited;  
24

25 (D) Cancel community activities; and  
26

27 (E) Cancel all non-essential travel; and  
28

29 (2) Orange - Substantial, indicating sustained community  
30 transmission, spread is ongoing, and recommended  
31 actions to be taken include:  
32

33 (A) Continue all measures from previous risk level;  
34

35 (B) Declare Public Health Emergency;  
36

37 (C) Limit access to some state/public installations;  
38

39 (D) Cancel large public gatherings and community  
40 activities; and  
41

42 (E) Limit travel; and

- 2 (3) Yellow - Moderate, indicating increased community
- 3 transmission, multiple people in multiple locations
- 4 have been infected, spread is contained, and
- 5 recommended actions to be taken include:
- 6
- 7 (A) Continue all measures from the previous level;
- 8
- 9 (B) Restrict travel in afflicted communities and
- 10 advise civilians of the risk;
- 11
- 12 (C) Limit access to specific installations; and
- 13
- 14 (D) Strongly advise against large public gatherings;
- 15 and
- 16
- 17 (4) Blue - Limited, indicating community transmission
- 18 beginning, sporadic and limited instances of
- 19 infection, and recommended actions to be taken
- 20 include:
- 21
- 22 (A) Re-emphasize health and hygiene protocols;
- 23
- 24 (B) Limit access to areas with direct connection to
- 25 infected individuals;
- 26
- 27 (C) Encourage cancelation of large public gatherings
- 28 and communities' activities; and
- 29
- 30 (D) Warn of risks of travel; and
- 31

32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each level would include clear  
33 instructions regarding the anticipated action of the government,  
34 for example, at the Red risk level citizens can expect the  
35 government and state facilities, including schools, will be shut  
36 down; and

37  
38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this advisory system would also  
39 have clear requirements, which would effectuate a change of risk  
40 levels, such as the number of COVID-19 cases in the State; and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each level would include  
2 recommended responses and actions to be taken by the public; and  
3

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
5 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, all Executive Branch  
6 Directors, Chief Justice, and Mayors of each county.
