## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE STATE OFFICE OF ENTERPRISE TECHNOLOGY SERVICES AND THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO COLLABORATE TO PROVIDE VIDEOCONFERENCE ACCESS FOR NEIGHBOR ISLAND RESIDENTS TO BE ABLE TO PARTICIPATE IN LEGISLATIVE HEARINGS AND SESSIONS.

WHEREAS, Legislative rules and practices encourage robust 1 debate provided through testimony from members of the public; 2 3 and 4 5 WHEREAS, a centralized system of State government provides for efficient coordination of government functions and services, 6 7 especially for a population spread out over separate islands; 8 and 9 10 issues relating to accessibility and delivery of WHEREAS, government information, services, and proceedings to residents 11 of Hawaii, Kauai, Maui, Lanai, Molokai, Niihau, and rural Oahu 12 remain an ongoing challenge, primarily due to the centralized 13 14 location of state government in Honolulu's urban core; and 15 WHEREAS, the public and its ability to enqage lawmakers and 16 17 participate fully in the democratic process would greatly benefit from safe, stable, and secure Internet-based access; and 18 19 WHEREAS, current technology makes it possible for 20 individuals to virtually attend and participate in legislative 21 hearings; and 22 23 WHEREAS, despite available technology, there are 24 operational and technical issues that must first be resolved in 25 26 order to implement services to allow the public to participate 27 in the legislative process via videoconferencing; now, 28 therefore, 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature 30 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, that the State 31
