SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY TO CONDUCT A STUDY TO IDENTIFY AND ADDRESS THE IMPACTS OF TOURISM ON COMMUNITIES THROUGHOUT THE STATE.

1 WHEREAS, tourism is the largest contributor to Hawaii's
2 economy, with visitors to Hawaii spending more than
3 \$17,000,000,000, in 2018, and generating more than
4 \$2,000,000,000 in tax revenue to the State in 2019; and
5

6 WHEREAS, tourism also supports more than two hundred
7 thousand jobs; and
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9 WHEREAS, in 2019, more than ten million visitors arrived in
10 Hawaii, setting a visitor arrival record for the eighth
11 consecutive year; and
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13 WHEREAS, this increase in visitors has caused additional
14 strain on infrastructure, facilities, and attractions utilized
15 and enjoyed by residents and tourists alike; and
16

17 WHEREAS, between 2010 and 2018, agreement by residents with
18 the statement "tourism brings more benefits than problems" has
19 declined from eighty percent to fifty-nine percent; and
20

21 WHEREAS, this decline illustrates residents' growing
22 concerns with the impacts that tourism may have on Hawaii's
23 natural resources and the residents' respective communities; and
24

25 WHEREAS, these concerns have led to the formation of
26 grassroots community groups that seek to mitigate the growing
27 impacts of tourism; and
28

29 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Tourism Authority has previously
30 collaborated with other agencies to address the impacts of
31 tourism; including collaborating with the Department of Land and
32 Natural Resources to develop the Haena State Park management



1 plan, funding "ambassadors" to manage traffic at Maunawili
2 Falls, and working with the City and County of Honolulu to fund
3 the installation of closed-circuit cameras in Waikiki; and
4

5 WHEREAS, tourism continues to remain an important part of
6 Hawaii's economy but is impacting numerous sites throughout the
7 State; and
8

9 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Tourism Authority has developed a new
10 strategic plan that includes a rebalancing of the Authority's
11 priorities with an emphasis on the Authority's tourism
12 management functions; now, therefore,
13

14 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature
15 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, that the Hawaii
16 Tourism Authority is requested to conduct a study to identify
17 and address the impacts of tourism on communities throughout the
18 State; and
19

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study include the
21 following:
22

- 23 (1) Identification and prioritization of issues caused by
24 tourism that impact communities throughout the State
25 and any sites in which those issues are particularly
26 prevalent;

- 28 (2) Development of processes to:
 - 29 (A) Address the issues identified pursuant to
30 paragraph (1);
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 - 32 (B) Determine any resources, including staffing,
33 necessary to identify affected stakeholders;

 - 35 (C) Facilitate multi-year discussions between public
36 and private stakeholders;

 - 38 (D) Work directly with public and private
39 stakeholders to address the issues identified
40 pursuant to paragraph (1);

- 1 (E) Assist affected communities and applicable public

- 6 (F) Identify sources of funding to address the issues
- 7 identified pursuant to paragraph (1), including
- 8 existing funds that may be reallocated;

- 10 (3) Identification of applicable federal, state, and
- 11 county agencies having jurisdiction to address the
- 12 issues identified pursuant to paragraph (1); and

- 14 (4) A recommended timetable for implementation of the
- 15 processes developed pursuant to paragraph (2); and

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Tourism Authority is
 18 requested to submit a report of its findings and
 19 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
 20 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
 21 the Regular Session of 2021; and

 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
 24 Resolution be transmitted to the President and Chief Executive
 25 Officer of the Hawaii Tourism Authority.
