SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH'S DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES DIVISION TO FIND A SOURCE OF FUNDING TO SUBSIDIZE THE DEVELOPMENT OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING FOR PEOPLE WITH INTELLECTUAL AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES.

1 WHEREAS, individuals with developmental disabilities are 2 disproportionately low-income and are often being priced out of 3 many neighborhoods, especially in urban areas, as rental prices continue to increase and affordable housing options diminish; 4 5 and 6 WHEREAS, individuals with developmental disabilities 7 8 compete with the general population with regard to housing; and 9 WHEREAS, some of these individuals rely on Supplemental 10 11 Security Income, which is the federal income maintenance program that assists people with significant and long-term disabilities 12 who have no assets and no other source of income, to meet their 13 14 basic needs; and 15 WHEREAS, the Supplemental Security Income payment is 16 insufficient to cover the cost of renting a studio unit in the 17 State, especially in areas where many necessary services are 18 available; and 19 20 WHEREAS, because of the disparity between the Supplemental 21 Security Income payment and high housing costs, individuals with 22 developmental disabilities are often forced into homelessness or 23 24 segregated, restrictive, and costly institutional living 25 arrangements; and 26 27 WHEREAS, in light of the inadequate federal resources for supporting individuals with developmental disabilities with 28 appropriate housing, it is critical to identify opportunities 29 30 for supplementing support at the state level; now, therefore, 31 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature 32 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, that the 33 34 Department of Health's Developmental Disabilities Division is

requested to identify potential sources of funding to subsidize 1 the development of affordable housing for people with 2 intellectual and developmental disabilities; and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Developmental Disabilities 5 Division is urged to submit a report of its findings and 6 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 7 Legislature prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 8 2021; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 11 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and Director of 12 Health. 13 14 15 16 OFFERED BY:
