Mr. President and Mr. Speaker,

Regarding Act No. 273 (2019), Marijuana Evaluation Task Force.

Act No. 273, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019, established a marijuana evaluation task force to examine other states' laws, penalties, and outcomes pertaining to marijuana use, other than marijuana use for medical purposes, and make recommendations on amending marijuana use penalties and outcomes in the State. The recommendations of the task force are due to the legislature no later than twenty days before the convening of the 2021 regular session.

Act 273 took effect January 11th, 2020, and the task force was expected to convene following the close of the 2020 legislative session. However, certain obstacles, most notably those related to the COVID-19 pandemic which both closed the State Capitol and caused the legislature to be convened in extended emergency sessions, prevented the task force from convening for a discussion on the issue with enough time to produce a meaningful report.

Accordingly, the task force will be unable to meet the reporting deadline.
