# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is one of the
- 2 most beautiful places on the planet, with breathtaking
- 3 landscapes, lush tropical forests, and rich ocean resources.
- 4 The State is home to amazing ecosystems that include a unique
- 5 mix of flora and fauna, including dozens of endemic Hawaiian
- 6 birds that can be found nowhere else on earth; approximately
- 7 one thousand four hundred species of native plants,
- 8 ninety per cent of which are endemic to the State; and familiar
- 9 marine mammals that are closely associated with the State,
- 10 including the Hawaiian monk seal and humpback whale.
- 11 The legislature also finds that state residents understand
- 12 the importance of these unique resources and appreciate their
- 13 value. More specifically, residents appreciate the beloved
- 14 native and endemic plants and animals of Hawaii, strongly
- 15 believe that these resources must be preserved for future
- 16 generations, and support opportunities to directly contribute to
- 17 the conservation of these critical resources.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:

12	conservat	ion; authorized. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the
13	contrary,	the director of finance shall issue to any registered
14	owner of	a motor vehicle, who is a resident of the State and has
15	completed	the application and paid the required fees, special
16	number pla	ates that commemorate the importance of environmental
17	conservat	ion, for the registered owner's motor vehicle.
18	(b)	The director of finance of the city and county of
19	Honolulu :	shall establish special number plate designs that
20	commemora	te the importance of environmental conservation. The
21	design sh	all:

1	(1)	Contain words or images, or both, that indicate that
2		the special number plate is being issued to
3		commemorate the importance of environmental
4		<pre>conservation;</pre>
5	(2)	Be similar in shape and size to the uniform state
6		number plate prescribed by law; and
7	(3)	Be readily identifiable and distinguishable under
8		actual traffic conditions.
9	The direc	tor of finance of the city and county of Honolulu shall
10	consult w	ith the directors of finance of the counties of Kauai,
11	Maui, and	Hawaii; the chiefs of police of the city and county of
12	Honolulu	and the counties of Kauai, Maui, and Hawaii; and the

14	establish	ing the special number plate design, which shall be
15	visually	attractive and highlight Hawaii's environment, native
16	species,	or both.
17	<u>(c)</u>	Each special number plate design shall not:
18	(1)	Infringe upon or otherwise violate any trademark,
19		trade name, service mark, copyright, or other
20		proprietary or property right;

1	(2)	Represent any obscene or degrading image, idea, word,
2		or phrase;
3	(3)	Advertise or endorse a product, brand, or service that
4		is provided for sale;
5	(4)	Promote any religious belief;
6	(5)	Promote any philosophy based on prejudice or that is
7		contrary to state civil rights laws; or
8	(6)	Obstruct the visibility of the number plate's numbers
9		or letters or any other information that is required
10		by law to be on a number plate.
11	(d)	Each special number plate shall be securely fastened
12	to the mo	tor vehicle in lieu of the uniform state number plate.
13	<u>(e)</u>	The director of finance shall charge a special number
14	plate fee	at least equal to the county's cost of providing the
15	special n	umber plate and administrative costs, if any, plus a
16	fundraisi	ng fee to be set by the department of land and natural
17	resources	. The fundraising fee established by this subsection
18	shall be	in addition to any other state or county fees collected
19	for a mot	or vehicle registration or license plates.
20	(f)	The revenue generated by the fundraising fees
21	establish	ed pursuant to subsection (e) shall be deposited into

- 15 adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to carry out this section."
- 16 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 19 provided that section 4 shall take effect on January 1, 2022.
