BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 486M-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended as follows: 3 1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted 4 and to read: ""Automated recycling kiosk" means an interactive device 5 that is installed within a secure retail space and performs the 6 7 following technological functions: (1) Only accepts for recycling previously owned handheld 8 9 electronic cellular phone devices; (2) Verifies a seller's identity through a combination of 10 technology within the kiosk and remote examination of 11 12 a government-issued identification by a live 13 representative during each transaction; (3) Securely stores devices accepted by the kiosk; 14 Records images of the seller and the devices accepted. 15 (4) 16 during the transaction;

- 19 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 20 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 21 begun before its effective date.
