A BILL FOR AN ACT

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RELATING TO THE FARM TO SCHOOL PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a key reason for the
- 2 creation of the Hawaii farm to school program in 2015 was to
- 3 improve the health of the State's keiki by encouraging
- 4 consumption of fresh, locally grown foods, both for their
- 5 nutritional content and to promote healthy behaviors at an early
- 6 age.
- 7 The legislature further finds that setting a target goal of
- 8 providing a fixed minimum percentage of locally sourced food in
- 9 public schools can bring the farm to school program closer to
- 10 achieving tangible results for the health of Hawaii's students,
- 11 including an increased consumption of fresh fruits and
- 12 vegetables and the potential to minimize diet-related diseases
- in childhood, such as obesity and diabetes.

- 15 school program from the department of agriculture to the
