A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE REPORTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 11-340, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

3 "(c) Subsection (b) notwithstanding, if a candidate
4 committee does not file the [~~second~~] preliminary primary report
5 that is due ten calendar days prior to a primary, initial
6 special, or initial nonpartisan election, or the preliminary
7 general report[~~7~~] that is due ten calendar days prior to a
8 general, subsequent special, or subsequent nonpartisan election;
9 or if a noncandidate committee does not file the preliminary
10 primary report that is due ten calendar days prior to a primary,
11 special, or nonpartisan election, or the [~~second~~] preliminary
12 general report that is due ten calendar days prior to a general
13 election by the due date, the fine, if assessed, shall not
14 exceed \$300 per day; provided that, in aggregate:

- 15 (1) The fine shall not exceed twenty-five per cent of the
16 total amount of contributions or expenditures,
17 whichever is greater, for the period covered by the
18 report; and



1 (2) The minimum fine, if assessed, shall be \$300."

2 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
3 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
4 begun before its effective date.

5 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
