A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE PARKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in order to
2	effectively manage the State as a visitor destination, new tools
3	are needed by the division of state parks of the department of
4	land and natural resources. In 2018, 11,300,000 residents and
5	tourists visited a state park. In 2019, about sixty per cent of
6	mainland visitors reported going to the beach and thirty-seven
7	per cent reported visiting a park during their stay in Hawaii.
8	Due to budget cuts and reduced funding resulting from the
9	COVID-19 pandemic, new self-funding tools are needed to
10	maintain, improve, and enhance the visitor experience at our
11	state parks.
12	The legislature further finds that the division needs
13	flexible methods to establish user fees to manage entrance,
14	parking, camping, and lodging. The private sector, through
15	industries such ϵ s hotels and airlines, utilizes dynamic pricing
16	strategies to manage natronage during flugtuating noriods of use

17 and demand.

	The registature also linus that the administrative			
2	rulemaking process under chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes,			
3	serves the important function of providing the opportunity for			
4	public review and input. However, it is not designed to quickly			
5	respond to rapidly changing resource conditions. An alternative			
6	process with fewer procedural steps would enable the board of			
7	land and natural resources to quickly update fee structures to			
8	respond to rapidly changing conditions, while also providing			
9	opportunity for public review and comment.			
10	The purpose of this Act is to:			
11	(1) Authorize the board of land and natural resources to			
12	adopt, amend, and repeal administrative fee schedules			
13	for the division of state parks within the department			
14	of land and natural resources by formal board action			
15	at a publicly noticed meeting; and			
16	(2) Raise the expenditure ceiling for the state parks			
17	special fund.			
18	SECTION 2. Chapter 184, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
19	amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately			
20	designated and to read as follows:			

1	" <u>§18</u>	4- Fee schedules.	(a) Notwithstanding any law to
2	the contr	ary, the board of land	and natural resources may adopt,
3	amend, or	repeal administrative	fee schedules, exempt from
4	chapter 9	1, for all camping, lod	ging, parking, group use, and
5	special u	se activities, includin	g entrance to Diamond Head State
6	Monument,	for which the departme	nt charges fees. Fee schedules
7	may be ad	opted at regular or spe	cial meetings of the board of
8	land and	natural resources pursu	ant to section 171-5.
9	(b)	The division of state	parks shall post notice on the
10	division'	s and department's webs	ites of proposed amendments to
11	administr	ative fee schedules at	least forty-five days prior to
12	the meeti	ng of the board of land	and natural resources at which
13	the amend	led fee schedule is to b	e considered. The notice shall
14	include:		
15	(1)	The full text of the p	roposed amended fee schedule in
16		Ramseyer format; and	
17	(2)	The date, time, and pl	ace where the board of land and
18		natural resources meet	ing is to be held and where
19		interested persons may	provide written testimony or be
20		heard on the proposed	fee schedule adoption,
21		amendment, or repeal.	

I	(c) The board of land and natural resources shall afford
2	all interested persons an opportunity to submit data, views, or
3	arguments, orally or in writing. The board of land and natural
4	resources shall fully consider all written and oral submissions
5	respecting the proposed administrative fee schedule and shall
6	make its decision at the public hearing pursuant to
7	section 171-5.
8	(d) Any administrative fee schedule adopted, amended, or
9	repealed pursuant to this section shall become effective ten
10	days after adoption by the board of land and natural resources,
11	unless otherwise specified by the board. If the board of land
12	and natural resources specifies a later effective date, the
13	later date shall be the effective date; provided that no
14	administrative fee schedule shall have an effective date more
15	than thirty days after adoption of the administrative fee
16	schedule by the board.
17	(e) The division of state parks shall maintain a file of
18	administrative fee schedules in Ramseyer format on the
19	division's and department's websites."
20	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the state parks
21	special fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may b

- 1 necessary for fiscal year 2021-2022 and the same sum or so much
- 2 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the
- 3 administration of the state parks programs pursuant to the state
- 4 parks special fund under section 184-3.4, Hawaii Revised
- 5 Statutes.
- The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 7 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2021. 9
