
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ORDERS OF THE CAMPAIGN SPENDING COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 11-410, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended as follows:

3 1. By amending subsection (b) to read:

4 "(b) Any order for the assessment of an administrative
5 fine shall not be issued against a person without providing the
6 person written notice and an opportunity to be heard at a
7 hearing conducted under chapter 91. A person may waive these
8 rights by written stipulation or consent. These rights shall be
9 deemed waived if the order is a preliminary determination of
10 probable cause rendered during a chapter 92 meeting pursuant to
11 section 11-404 and the person fails to request a contested case
12 hearing within twenty days of receipt of the preliminary
13 determination, as provided in section 11-405(b)."

14 2. By amending subsection (d) to read:

15 "(d) If the person to whom the commission's order is
16 directed does not comply with the order, the first circuit
17 court, upon application of the commission, shall issue an order



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1 requiring the person to comply with the commission's order.
2 Failure to obey such a court order shall be punished as
3 contempt. In addition to initiating contempt proceedings, the
4 commission may file the commission's order in the first circuit
5 court to have the order confirmed as a judgment, which shall
6 then have the same force and effect and shall be enforceable and
7 collectible in the same manner as other judgments issued by the
8 circuit courts; provided that there shall be no appeal from the
9 judgment."

10 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.

11 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Campaign Spending Commission Package; Orders; Enforcement of Judgments; Fines

Description:

Provides that certain rights shall be deemed waived if a preliminary determination of probable cause is rendered during a chapter 92 meeting and the person fails to request a contested case hearing within 20 days of receipt of the preliminary determination. Allows the Campaign Spending Commission to have an order confirmed as a judgment by the first circuit court, giving the order the same force and effect as any other judgment issued by the circuit courts; provided that there shall be no appeal from the judgment.
