# A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO PROVIDE FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE LEGISLATURE, THE AUDITOR, THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU, THE OMBUDSMAN, AND THE ETHICS COMMISSION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. There is appropriated out of the general

2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$9,629,159 or so much

thereof as may be necessary to the senate for the following

expenses:

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- (1) The sum of \$8,640,409 for defraying any and all session and nonsession expenses of the senate up to and including June 30, 2022, including the 2021 regular session, thirty-first legislature of the State of Hawaii and pre-session expenses and the expenses of any committee or committees established during the interim between the 2021 and 2022 regular sessions;
- (2) The sum of \$977,500 for defraying the expenses of the legislative information system for cost items such as hardware, software, consultants, installation, materials, supplies, and other related costs

1		associated with the legislative information system	
2		that have been or will be incurred; and	
3	(3)	The sum of \$11,250 for defraying the cost of the	
4		legislative broadcasting program to pay for the	
5		production and distribution of television broadcasts	
6		of legislative proceedings.	
7	The	sum appropriated in this section shall be expended by	
8	the senate.		
9	SECT	ION 2. There is appropriated out of the general	
10	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$13,137,606 or so	
11	much thereof as may be necessary to the house of representatives		
12	for the f	ollowing expenses:	
13	(1)	The sum of \$12,657,144 for defraying any and all	
14		session and nonsession expenses of the house of	
15		representatives up to and including June 30, 2022,	
16		including the 2021 regular session, thirty-first	
17		legislature of the State of Hawaii and pre-session	
18		expenses and the expense of any committee or	
19		committees established during the interim between the	
20		2021 and 2022 regular sessions;	

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1	(2)	The sum of \$409,212 for defraying the expenses of the	
2		legislative information system for cost items such as	
3		hardware, software, consultants, installation,	
4		materials, supplies, and other related costs	
5		associated with the legislative information system	
6		that have been or will be incurred; and	
7	(3)	The sum of \$11,250 for defraying the cost of the	
8		legislative broadcasting program to pay for the	
9		production and distribution of television broadcasts	
10		of legislative proceedings.	
11	The	sum appropriated in this section shall be expended by	
12	the house	of representatives.	
13	SECTION 3. Payment of expenses of the senate during the		
14	interim between the 2021 and 2022 regular sessions shall be made		
15	only with the approval of the president of the senate, and		
16	payment of expenses of the house of representatives during the		
17	interim between the 2021 and 2022 regular sessions shall be mad		
18	only with the approval of the speaker of the house of		
19	representatives.		
20	SECT	ION 4. Before January 19, 2022, the senate and the	
21	house of	representatives shall each have their accounts audited,	

- 1 and a full report of the respective audits shall be presented to
- 2 the senate and house of representatives convening on January 19,
- **3** 2022.
- 4 SECTION 5. Unless otherwise prescribed by law, the
- 5 expenses of any member of the legislature while traveling abroad
- $\mathbf{6}$  on official business of the legislature shall be \$145 a day as
- 7 authorized by the president of the senate and speaker of the
- 8 house of representatives.
- 9 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,091,122 or so much
- 11 thereof as may be necessary to the office of the auditor for the
- 12 following expenses:
- 13 (1) The sum of \$2,953,122 for defraying the expenses of
- 14 the office of the auditor during fiscal year
- 15 2021-2022; and
- 16 (2) The sum of \$138,000 during fiscal year 2021-2022 for:
- 17 (A) Performing special studies;
- 18 (B) Improving capabilities for planning, programming,
- and budgeting;
- 20 (C) Fulfilling other special requests made of the
- 21 auditor by the legislature or jointly by the

1		president of the senate and the speaker of the			
2		house of representatives;			
3	(D)	Legislative studies and contractual services for			
4		those studies; and			
5	(E)	Such other purposes as may be determined by the			
6		joint action of the president of the senate and			
7		the speaker of the house of representatives.			
8	The sum appropriated in this section shall be expended by				
9	the auditor.				
10	SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general				
11	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,800,000 or so much				
12	thereof as may be necessary to the office of the auditor during				
13	fiscal year 2021-2022 to be deposited into the audit revolving				
14	fund established pursuant to section 23-3.6, Hawaii Revised				
15	Statutes.				
16	SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the audit				
17	revolving fund the sum of \$6,300,000 or so much thereof as may				
18	be necessary to the office of the auditor during fiscal year				
19	2021-2022 for the office to conduct or complete its audit				
20	functions as provided by law.				
21	The sum a	ppropriated shall be expended by the auditor.			

- 1 SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,439,879 or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary to the legislative reference bureau
- 4 for defraying the expenses of the legislative reference bureau
- 5 during fiscal year 2021-2022, including equipment relating to
- 6 computer systems programming and operations.
- 7 The sum appropriated in this section shall be expended by
- 8 the legislative reference bureau.
- 9 SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the general
- 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,327,566 or so much
- 11 thereof as may be necessary to the office of the ombudsman for
- 12 defraying the expenses of the office during fiscal year
- **13** 2021–2022.
- 14 The sum appropriated in this section shall be expended by
- 15 the ombudsman.
- 16 SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of the general
- 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,152,454 or so much
- 18 thereof as may be necessary to the office of the state ethics
- 19 commission for defraying the expenses of the office during
- 20 fiscal year 2021-2022.

1 The sum appropriated in this section shall be expended by

2 the state ethics commission.

3 SECTION 12. There is appropriated out of the general

4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the following sums or so much

5 thereof as may be necessary to be expended for the purpose of

6 accrued vacation payments and vacation transfer payments for any

7 employee leaving the employ of the senate, house of

8 representatives, office of the auditor, legislative reference

9 bureau, office of the ombudsman, and state ethics commission:

17 provided that the appropriate expending agency shall first make

18 payments from the vacation payout allocation before expending

19 funds from turnover and vacancy amounts; and provided further

20 that any unexpended funds shall lapse to the general fund on

21 June 30, 2022.

- 1 SECTION 13. As of the close of business on June 30, 2022,
- 2 the unexpended or unencumbered balance of any appropriation made
- 3 by this Act shall lapse into the general fund.
- 4 SECTION 14. Each section of this Act is declared to be
- 5 severable from the remainder of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 15. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
