A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE REDUCED IGNITION PROPENSITY CIGARETTE PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii enacted
- 2 Act 218, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, to regulate reduced
- 3 ignition propensity cigarettes. As stated in section 132C-1,
- 4 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the intent of this law is to "require
- 5 that only reduced ignition propensity cigarette be sold in the
- 6 State." Certifications for cigarettes must be renewed every
- 7 three years at a fee of \$375 per cigarette brand and style,
- 8 which must be paid to the state fire council. These fees are
- 9 deposited into the reduced ignition propensity cigarette special
- 10 fund. Moneys in the special fund are used to pay for an
- 11 administrator, random testing, and other administrative and
- 12 enforcement costs.
- 13 The legislature further finds that in 1979, the legislature
- 14 abolished the state fire marshal's office and created the state
- 15 fire council, which comprises the four county fire chiefs and is
- 16 administratively attached to the department of labor and
- 17 industrial relations. The goal of the state fire council is to

- 1 develop and maintain a comprehensive fire service management
- 2 network for the protection of life, property, and the
- 3 environment throughout the State. The state fire council is
- 4 tasked with reviewing and adopting the state fire code,
- 5 providing administrative oversight of the reduced ignition
- 6 propensity cigarette program, providing assistance with the
- 7 application and administration of federal grants for the fire
- 8 service, assisting and coordinating with the statewide delivery
- 9 of fire training programs, coordinating the collection of fire
- 10 data, and supporting contingency planning needs for fire
- 11 fighters. The council may establish statewide qualifications
- 12 for testing, certifying, and credentialing individuals who
- 13 perform maintenance and testing of portable fire extinguishers,
- 14 fire protection systems, and fire alarm systems. The council
- 15 may also advise the governor and the legislature on matters
- 16 related to fire prevention, fire protection, and life safety.
- 17 The state fire council is a voting member of the state building
- 18 code council, whose responsibilities are delineated in
- 19 section 107-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- The legislature recognizes that from its inception until
- 21 2001, the state fire council had no funding for staff to fulfill

- 1 its responsibilities. The state fire council relied upon county
- 2 personnel to perform its duties along with their normal
- 3 functions within their fire departments. In 2001, the governor
- 4 directed department of labor and industrial relations to
- 5 allocate \$35,000 into its budget to fund the first part-time
- 6 employee. In 2011, an additional \$71,000 was appropriated by
- 7 the legislature to hire two additional personnel. With money
- 8 from the reduced ignition propensity cigarette special fund, the
- 9 state fire council could hire additional personnel to oversee
- 10 the coordination of statewide fire data collection and analysis
- 11 and administer federal fire-related grants. The state fire
- 12 council would also be able to fund statewide educational efforts
- 13 for the protection of life, property, and the environment, such
- 14 as the statewide fire fighter's safety guide program for
- 15 Hawaii's youth and the residential smoke alarm installation
- 16 program for Hawaii's at-risk senior population.
- 17 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to authorize the
- 18 use of the reduced ignition propensity cigarette program special
- 19 fund to support the duties and responsibilities of the state
- 20 fire council in addition to funding the administration and

- 1 enforcement of the reduced ignition propensity cigarette
- 2 program.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 132C-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 "[+] \$132C-9[+] Reduced ignition propensity cigarette
- 6 program special fund. (a) There is established in the state
- 7 treasury a reduced ignition propensity cigarette program special
- 8 fund, into which shall be deposited all moneys collected by the
- 9 state fire council from the reduced ignition propensity
- 10 cigarette program pursuant to section 132C-4. [All interest]
- 11 Interest earned or accrued on moneys deposited in the fund shall
- 12 become part of the fund.
- 13 (b) [Moneys] Money in the reduced ignition propensity
- 14 cigarette program special fund shall be administered and
- 15 expended by the state fire council to defray the actual cost of
- 16 activities and requirements of section 132C-4, including
- 17 employing one full-time administrator and one full-time
- 18 assistant whose duties include:
- 19 (1) Adopting administrative rules for program
- 20 implementation, establishing compliance inspections,

1		and approving forms and enforcement procedures and
2		guidelines;
3	(2)	Receiving certifications for approximately six hundred
4		different brands and styles of cigarettes from the
5		manufacturers;
6	(3)	Compiling a list of the cigarette brands and styles
7		for which manufacturers have submitted certifications,
8		verifying tax stamp compliance with the department of
9		the attorney general, and posting the list of
10		certified brands and styles on a state website for
11		informational purposes only;
12	(4)	Reviewing and approving, as needed, any alternative
13		test methods or fire standard compliance markings
14		submitted by the manufacturer; and
15	(5)	If needed, submitting certified cigarettes to an
16		accredited laboratory for testing to verify that
17		performance standards have been met.
18	<u>(c)</u>	Money in the special fund may also be administered and
19	expended ?	by the state fire council to defray the cost of
20	statewide	fire prevention, education, life safety, and
21	preparedn	ess programs, especially as they relate to youth,

- 1 seniors, and persons with disabilities, including the hiring of
- 2 administrative personnel."
- 3 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2060.
