A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING SAVINGS ACCOUNTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the price of a home
- 2 is rising faster than incomes. Though rental housing costs vary
- 3 by county in the State, the biggest expense for any individual
- 4 or family is housing or shelter. It is harder and harder for
- 5 individuals and families to save for a down payment on a home or
- $oldsymbol{6}$ pay for their mortgage or rent. Furthermore, the cost of
- 7 housing in Hawaii has increasingly become more of a challenge
- 8 for renters and homeowners.
- 9 The legislature further finds that state and county housing
- 10 agencies have been trying to create affordable housing for
- 11 decades. However, development costs are so high and the
- 12 shortage of affordable housing so great that traditional
- 13 programs have been able to create only a fraction of what is
- 14 needed.
- 15 The legislature also finds that creative, new approaches
- 16 are needed to help with Hawaii's affordable housing crisis. One
- 17 such option would be the creation of a housing savings account

- 1 system, which would establish a mechanism to facilitate saving
- 2 for housing via automatic payroll deductions. Under a housing
- 3 savings account system, employers would be required to offer
- 4 employees the opportunity to contribute to the housing savings
- 5 accounts, although employee participation would be optional.
- 6 However, the legislature notes that this type of proposal
- 7 requires a thorough analysis, including the costs, benefits, and
- 8 feasibility of implementing such a program.
- 9 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require the
- 10 legislative reference bureau to conduct a study on the
- 11 establishment of a housing savings account system that would
- 12 provide every employee in the State the ability to automatically
- 13 contribute to a housing savings account through payroll
- 14 deductions.
- 15 SECTION 2. (a) The legislative reference bureau shall
- 16 conduct a study on the establishment of a housing savings
- 17 account system that would provide every employee in the State
- 18 the ability to automatically continue to a housing savings
- 19 account through payroll deductions.
- 20 (b) When conducting the study, the legislative reference
- 21 bureau shall include an assessment on the costs, including staff

1	and opera	ating costs; benefits; implementation strategy; and
2	timeline	for establishing a housing savings account system that
3	includes	the following components:
4	(1)	A board responsible for the administration of the
5		housing savings account system;
6	(2)	A requirement that each employer in the State offer
7		its employees the opportunity to contribute to a
8		housing savings account through payroll deduction;
9	(3)	The ability for each employer in the State to match an
10		employee's contribution into the employee's housing
11		savings account;
12	(4)	A prohibition on funds in a housing savings account
13		receiving any additional tax benefits or being exempt
14		from state income tax;
15	(5)	The ability for funds contributed into a housing
16		savings account to be used for any purpose, including
17		but not limited to:
18		(A) Down payments;
19		(B) Mortgage payments;
20		(C) Rent; or
21		(D) Security deposits;

1	(6)	A requirement for employers to enroll participating
2		employees in the housing savings account system and
3		report enrollment information to the board;
4	(7)	The ability for employees to opt out of contributing
5		to a housing savings account at any time; and
6	(8)	A default individual housing savings account
7		contribution rate of five per cent of each employee's
8		compensation, with an option for an employee to elect
9		to contribute a different amount on a form to be
10		developed by the employer.
11	(c)	The legislative reference bureau shall submit a report
12	of its fi	ndings and recommendations, including any proposed
13	legislati	on, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
14	to the co	nvening of the regular session of 2022.
15	SECT	ION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
