A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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PART I

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of education is the only public education system in the country that is wholly state funded. This singular funding status has resulted in the department of education facing unique challenges to utilizing funds provided by the federal government to offset the negative economic impacts of the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic.

9 The legislature also finds that the states that receive 10 certain federal funds, including moneys from the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund established by the 11 12 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, Public Law 116-136 (CARES Act), and the Coronavirus Response and Relief 13 Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021, Public Law 116-260 (CRRS 14 Appropriations Act), are required to assure that they will 15 maintain support for education programs during fiscal years 16 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 by meeting certain benchmarks. 17

1 The legislature further finds that the CARES Act created 2 the federal Education Stabilization Fund. The State, through 3 the department of education, must comply with the provisions of 4 the federal Education Stabilization Fund as set forth in 5 sections 18006 and 18008 of the CARES Act and sections 315 and 6 317 of the CRRS Appropriations Act in order to receive and 7 expend CARES Act and CRRS Appropriations Act moneys. In 8 accepting and expending federal CARES Act and CRRS 9 Appropriations Act moneys, it is the legislature's intent that 10 the department of education employees who are subject to a collective bargaining agreement continue to receive their pay. 11 12 The legislature also finds that the State, through the 13 department of education, must also comply with the "maintenance of effort" provisions set forth in section 18008 of the CARES 14 Act. These provisions require funding for public education to 15 be maintained at the same funding levels as in fiscal years 16 17 2017, 2018, and 2019, for those funds that are part of the CARES Act, and at a proportional funding level for the CRRS 18 19 Appropriations Act.

The legislature declares that it does not support any
attempts by the superintendent of education to seek a waiver
from the Secretary of Education.

4 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate certain federal 5 moneys received by the State to the department of education to 6 offset any budget reductions that have been identified or proposed by the department of education and the governor that 7 would result in the reduction of personnel who are subject to a 8 9 collective bargaining agreement executed pursuant to chapter 89, 10 Hawaii Revised Statutes, and who are employed at the school level, including any budget reduction that would result in a 11 layoff, furlough, or pay reduction. 12

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PART II

SECTION 2. This part is recommended by the governor for immediate passage in accordance with article VII, section 9, of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of elementary and secondary school emergency relief fund moneys received by the State from the CARES Act and CRRS Appropriations Act, the sum of or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to offset any budget reductions that have been

Makes an emergency appropriation for fiscal year 2020-2021 from elementary and secondary school emergency relief fund (ESSER funds) moneys received by the State from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act and the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act to offset any budget reductions that are identified or proposed by the department of education and the governor that would result in the reduction of personnel who are subject to a collective bargaining agreement pursuant to Chapter 89, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and who are employed at the school level, including any budget reduction that would result in a layoff, furlough, or pay reduction. Requires the Board of Education and superintendent of education to certify in writing that the Board of Education, superintendent, and department of education agree to certain conditions, including that the funds appropriated shall be used only for salaries and wages of officers and employees who are subject to a collective bargaining agreement and are employed at the school level in the classroom. Makes an appropriation for fiscal years 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 from the same source of funding and with the same conditions. Parts I, III, and IV effective 7/1/2051. Part II effective 5/1/2050.
