A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOTELS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the coronavirus
2	disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic continues to threaten the
3	health and safety of the public, especially those healthcare
4	workers and first responders who are at a higher risk of
5	exposure to COVID-19. The legislature also finds that from
6	April 6, 2020, to May 31, 2020, the Hawaii tourism authority,
7	Hawaii Visitors and Convention Bureau, and Hawaii Lodging and
8	Tourism Association worked collaboratively to implement a hotels
9	for heroes program. This program provided complimentary hotel
10	rooms to certain healthcare workers and first responders who
11	wished to avoid exposing their respective households and
12	families to COVID-19. Following a request for the Hawaii
13	emergency management agency to provide safe housing for
14	healthcare workers and first responders, the agency, in
15	collaboration with the Hawaii tourism authority and the Hawaii

16 Visitors and Convention Bureau, developed a hotels for heroes

- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require the

- 10 SECTION 2. The Hawaii emergency management agency and

- 15 risk of exposure to COVID-19 and want to limit the possibility

- 17 COVID-19; provided that the program shall terminate on
- 18 January 1, 2022.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
