A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 88, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 2 by adding a new section to subpart C of part II to be 3 appropriately designated and to read as follows: 4 "§88- Forfeiture of benefits; felony convictions. (a) 5 If a member, former member, or retirant is convicted of a felony 6 and the court finds that, by a preponderance of the evidence, 7 the felony is related to the employment of the member, former 8 member, or retirant by the State or any county, the court may 9 decree pursuant to section 706-605(8), a civil penalty of 10 forfeiture by the member, former member, or retirant of one-half 11 of any: 12 (1) Interest; 13 (2) Hypothetical account balance in excess of the amount 14 representing any employee contributions made by or on 15 behalf of the member, former member, or retirant;
- (3) <u>Pension;</u>
- 17 (4) Annuity; or

1 (5) Retirement allowance, 2 to which the member, former member, or retirant may otherwise be 3 entitled under this chapter; provided that upon the death of the 4 member, former member, or retirant, the designated beneficiary 5 of the member, former member, or retirant may receive the 6 reduced benefits to which the member, former member, or retirant 7 would be entitled under this section; provided further that a 8 designated beneficiary who is also convicted of a felony based 9 on the same set of circumstances as the member, former member, 10 or retirant who were subject to civil penalty under this 11 section, shall not receive any benefits. 12 (b) Upon receipt of a certified copy of the order 13 decreeing forfeiture, the system shall comply with the order and 14 shall reduce, suspend, or deny payment to the member, former 15 member, retirant, or designated beneficiary, if applicable, as 16 provided in the order until such time as the system receives a 17 certified order to: 18 (1) Increase, resume, or make payments to the member, 19 former member, retirant, or designated beneficiary; or 20 (2) Quash or reverse the decree of forfeiture.

19	(4)	Felonies committed against a person over whom the
20		employee, in the course of the employee's duties,

Employees' Retirement System; Retirement Benefits; Felony Convictions; Forfeiture

Description:

Authorizes a court to order the forfeiture of one-half of the Employees' Retirement System (ERS) benefits of an ERS member, former member, or retirant upon conviction of the individual for a felony related to the State or county employment of the individual. Authorizes designated beneficiaries to receive the ERS benefits to which the member, former member or retirant would be entitled under this section upon the death of the member, former member, or retirant. Prohibits designated beneficiaries convicted of a felony under the same set of circumstances as the member, former member, or retirant who was subject to forfeiture of ERS benefits from receiving benefits. Effective 1/1/2050. (SD1)
