A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE X, SECTION 1, OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII TO REQUIRE THAT THE STATEWIDE PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM BE THOROUGH AND EFFICIENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that article X, section 1, of the Hawaii State Constitution requires the State 2 to provide a system of public education but makes no mention of 3 the quality of the education system that the State is obligated 4 5 to provide. Compared to other states, Hawaii is unique because 6 the State, rather than a county or local level jurisdiction, is 7 responsible for public education. While the United Nations has 8 declared education to be a fundamental human right because a 9 quality education is a critical asset for individuals and 10 economies competing in today's globalized world, Hawaii 11 struggles to provide a quality education to all keiki. 12 struggle is evidenced by a chronic teacher shortage that stands 13 at over one thousand positions per year, decaying school 14 facilities, and the fact that Hawaii spends less total tax 15 revenue on public education than any other state in the nation.

1 The legislature also finds that the virus known as "SARS-2 CoV-2" causes a disease named "coronavirus disease 2019" 3 (COVID-19), which spread globally and was declared a pandemic by 4 the World Health Organization on March 11, 2020. Upon reaching 5 Hawaii's shores, the COVID-19 outbreak disrupted the public 6 school system, leading to statewide school closures and the 7 widespread adoption of remote learning programs by teachers, parents, and students. The pandemic highlighted inequalities 8 9 existing within Hawaii's public education system, with socioeconomically disadvantaged communities and impoverished 10 11 families often lacking the resources needed to participate in 12 distance learning programs. Similarly, special education and 13 high-needs students faced challenges in accessing the resources 14 needed to support their educational progress. While these 15 problems were revealed by the COVID-19 pandemic, they reflect 16 and exacerbate longstanding disparities in the State's public 17 school system, including an ongoing and chronic teacher 18 shortage, inadequate resources for special education and 19 high-needs children, deteriorating public school facilities, and 20 a lack of culturally relevant education opportunities for Native 21 Hawaiian students.

There shall be no discrimination in public 14 educational institutions because of race, religion, sex or 15 ancestry; nor shall public funds be appropriated for the support 16 or benefit of any sectarian or nonsectarian private educational 17 institution, except that proceeds of special purpose revenue 18 bonds authorized or issued under section 12 of Article VII may 19 be appropriated to finance or assist:

- 1. Not-for-profit corporations that provide early
- 2 childhood education and care facilities serving the general

- 7 SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall
- 8 be as follows:

- 12 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050, and
- 13 this amendment shall take effect upon compliance with
- 14 article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of the State of
