A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUMAN TRAFFICKING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"PART .
5	CENTER TO COMBAT HUMAN TRAFFICKING
6	"\$28- Center to combat human trafficking. (a) There
7	is established within the department of the attorney general a
8	program to be known as the center to combat human trafficking to
9	assist in the implementation of federal and state laws relating
10	to human trafficking.
11	(b) The department shall oversee programs to coordinate
12	the efforts of state and county agencies with those of federal
13	agencies in locating, recovering, and protecting victims of
14	human trafficking and promote community awareness of the problem
15	of human trafficking.
16	(c) The department of the attorney general shall employ,

without regard to chapter 76, a coordinator and an assistant to

- 1 the coordinator who shall coordinate existing public and private
- 2 resources and further define and develop, to the extent of
- 3 available resources, the most appropriate system for addressing
- 4 the problem of human trafficking, which may include the
- 5 following:
- 6 (1) A communication network among state and county law
- 7 enforcement agencies and the National Crime
- 8 Information Center in Washington, D.C.;
- 9 (2) A standardized reporting system in all counties
- developed in conjunction with federal, state, and
- 11 county law enforcement officials;
- 12 (3) Assistance in the establishment of trained teams that
- can be activated in each county;
- 14 (4) Educational programs designed to prevent child
- abduction, enhance child safety, and raise public
- awareness about ways to prevent child abduction,
- molestation, sexual exploitation, and human

- 19 (5) A directory of resources to assist in locating victims

3	(6)	A statewide centralized, uniform, and computerized

5	SECT	ION 2. Section 712-1202, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended b	y amending subsection (1) to read as follows:
7	"(1)	A person commits the offense of sex trafficking if
8	the perso	n knowingly:
9	(a)	Advances prostitution by compelling or inducing a
10		person by force, threat, fraud, or intimidation to
11		engage in prostitution, or profits from such conduct
12		by another; or
13	(b)	Advances or profits from prostitution of a minor;
14		provided that [with respect to the victim's age, the
15		prosecution shall be required to prove only that the
16		person-committing the offense acted negligently.] the
17		state of mind requirement for this offense is not
18		applicable to the fact that the victim was a minor. A
19		person is strictly liable with respect to the
20		attendant circumstance that the victim was a minor."

1	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
3	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2021-2022 and
4	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
5	year 2022-2023 for the center to combat human trafficking
6	established pursuant to section 1 of this Act.
7	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
8	of the attorney general for the purposes of this Act.
9	SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
10	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
11	begun before its effective date.
12	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
13	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
15	provided that section 1 of this Act shall take effect on
16	July 1, 2021.
