
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3 and to read as follows:

4 "§321- Public swimming pools; inspection fee. The
5 department shall establish a fee of no less than \$ for
6 the inspection of a public swimming pool.

7 For the purposes of this chapter, "public swimming pool"
8 means any swimming pool, other than a private residential
9 swimming pool, which is intended to be used collectively by a
10 number of persons for swimming or bathing regardless of whether
11 a fee is charged for the use. These pools shall include but not
12 be limited to public wading pools, therapeutic pools, spas, and
13 similar pools."

14 SECTION 2. Section 321-373.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15 amended as follows:



1 1. By amending subsection (b) to read:

2 "(b) Each initial permit application under this section
3 shall be accompanied by a fee of [~~\$125~~] \$_____ for a permit
4 valid for one year. For renewal of a permit, each applicant
5 shall pay a fee of [~~\$75~~] \$_____ per year. Initial permit
6 application and renewal fees may be increased by not more than
7 [~~\$10~~] \$_____ per year."

8 2. By amending subsection (d) to read:

9 "(d) The department may issue a temporary permit valid for
10 a maximum of seven consecutive days per calendar year for
11 locations other than a permitted tattoo shop for the purpose of
12 a trade show, product demonstration, or educational
13 demonstration; provided that the show or demonstration shall
14 meet all safety and hygiene standards as specified by the
15 director and in this chapter. The temporary permit application
16 shall be made in writing to the department at least sixty days
17 prior to the scheduled event, shall include specific measures to
18 meet specified health and safety standards, and may be subject
19 to a site inspection. Temporary permit applicants shall pay a
20 [~~\$50~~] \$_____ nonrefundable application fee in addition to:



1 (1) A [~~\$500~~] \$ _____ nonrefundable permit fee for an
2 event featuring not more than forty participating
3 tattoo artists; or

4 (2) A [~~\$50~~] \$ _____ nonrefundable permit fee for an
5 event featuring less than three participating tattoo
6 artists demonstrating for educational purposes only,
7 without compensation, consideration, or donation by
8 the public;

9 provided that the department may annually increase the fees
10 specified in paragraphs (1) and (2) by not more than [~~\$100~~]
11 \$ _____ and [~~\$10~~] \$ _____ per year, respectively."

12 SECTION 3. Section 338-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13 amended to read as follows:

14 **"§338-2 Authority and duties of the department of health.**

15 The department of health, herein referred to as the department,
16 shall:

17 (1) Establish a central bureau of public health statistics
18 with suitable offices properly equipped for the safety
19 and preservation of all its official records;

20 (2) Install a statewide system of public health
21 statistics;



1 (3) Make and amend, after notice and hearing, necessary
2 regulations, give instructions and prescribe forms for
3 collecting, transcribing, compiling, and preserving
4 public health statistics; [~~and~~]

5 (4) Coordinate public health statistics, public health
6 program data, epidemiological data, and administrative
7 data from providers of health insurance doing business
8 in the State to implement and update a statewide
9 public health planning and public health program
10 development program; and

11 [~~4~~] (5) Enforce this part and the regulations made
12 pursuant thereto.

13 For purposes of this chapter, "public health planning" means the
14 development of long-term strategic objectives and policies to
15 improve the access, quality, and sustainability of public health
16 in the State."

17 SECTION 4. Section 338-14.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18 amended to read as follows:

19 "**§338-14.5 Copies of certificate; fees.** The fees for
20 certified copies of birth, marriage, divorce, or death
21 certificates issued by the department of health shall consist of



1 [~~\$10~~] \$ _____ for the first copy issued and [~~\$4~~] \$ _____
2 for each copy issued thereafter. These fees shall be collected
3 for each single request for certified copies. All fees received
4 for the issuance of certified copies of birth, marriage,
5 divorce, or death certificates shall be remitted to the director
6 of health. Upon the receipt of remittances under this section,
7 the director of health shall deposit:

8 (1) \$1 for each certified copy to the credit of the spouse
9 and child abuse special fund established under section
10 346-7.5;

11 (2) \$1 for each certified copy to the credit of the spouse
12 and child abuse special account established under
13 section 601-3.6;

14 (3) \$1 for each certified copy to the credit of the
15 domestic violence and sexual assault special fund
16 established under section 321-1.3;

17 (4) \$1 for each certified copy to the credit of the vital
18 statistics improvement special fund established under
19 section 338-14.6; and

20 (5) The remainder of the fee for each certified copy to
21 the credit of the state general fund."



1 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

3 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2060.

Report Title:

Department of Health; Public Health Statistics; Public Health Data; Public Swimming Pools Inspections; Vital Records; Tattoo Artists; Fees

Description:

Requires the department of health to establish a fee for inspections of public swimming pools. Increases the annual permit fee and temporary permit fee for tattoo artists. Increases the fee for certified copies of vital statistic records. Requires the department of health to coordinate public health statistics and other public health data to implement and update a statewide public health planning and public health program development program. Effective 7/1/2060. (HD1)
