
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3 and to read as follows:

4 "§103F- Medicaid provider requirement; awarding of
5 contracts. (a) Any provider that is awarded a contract by
6 competitive purchase of services pursuant to section 103F-402
7 shall be a qualified medicaid provider in the State as a
8 condition of being awarded the contract; provided that if the
9 provider is not a qualified medicaid provider at the time the
10 provider is awarded the contract, the provider shall have up to
11 one year after the date on the notice of award to apply and be
12 qualified as a medicaid provider by the department of human
13 services.

14 (b) When applicable, the department of health shall make
15 available to each provider being awarded a contract an
16 explanation, through a memorandum of understanding, of how the
17 provider may capture federal medicaid moneys."



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1 SECTION 2. Section 103F-402, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:


3 "(b) The request shall state all criteria which will be
4 used to evaluate proposals, including the requirements pursuant
5 to section 103F- , and the relative importance of the proposal
6 evaluation criteria."

7 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
