A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RENTALS OF MOPEDS AND MOTOR SCOOTERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that wearing a helmet
3	while operating a moped, powered scooter, or other motorized
4	cycle decreases fatalities and serious injuries. In August
5	2017, Alexis "Lexi" Jenkins, a visitor to Maui who was not
6	wearing a helmet, suffered a fatal accident when the rented
7	moped she was riding collided with a truck.
8	According to the Hawaii Injury Prevention Plan for 2012-
9	2017, published by the Hawaii state department of health and
10	emergency medical services and injury prevention system branch,
11	properly worn helmets prevent death and brain injuries. In the
12	event of a crash, helmets reduce the risk of death by forty-two
13	per cent and the risk of a head injury by sixty-nine per cent.
14	The legislature recognizes that wearing a helmet can be a
15	significant factor in helping to reduce fatalities or the
16	severity of injuries in accidents like this on Hawaii's
17	roadways.

11	operate a motorcycle or an equivalent license issued from

18	[(b)] <u>(e)</u> No person less than eighteen years of age shall
19	operate or ride as a passenger on a motorcycle or motor scooter
20	on any highway in the State unless the person wears a safety
21	helmet securely fastened with a chin strap.

15	(1)	Every motor vehicle that has a handlebar and seating
16		that requires the operator to straddle or sit astride
17		on it and is designed to travel on not more than three

20	(2)	Every motor vehicle that has a steering wheel and
21		seating that does not require the operator to straddle

8	SECTION 5. Section 291C-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended by amending the definition of "motor scooter" to read as

12	(1) Every motor vehicle that has a handlebar and seating
13	that requires the operator to straddle or sit astride
14	on it and is designed to travel on not more than three
15	wheels in contact with the ground, but excludes a farm
16	tractor and a moped; or
17	(2) Every motor vehicle that has a steering wheel and
18	seating that does not require the operator to straddle
19	or sit astride on it, and is designed to travel on
20	three wheels in contact with the ground, called an
21	autocycle which is certified by the manufacturer to

1	comply with all applicable Federal Motor Vehicle
2	Safety Standards as of the date of manufacture,
3	with a motor which produces not more than five horsepower, but
4	excludes a moped."
5	SECTION 6. Section 291C-195, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
7	"(a) [No] Notwithstanding section 286-81(b), no person
8	[less] <u>:</u>
9	(1) Less than fifteen years of age shall drive a moped on
10	a highway, street, roadway, or any other public
11	property in the State[. No person less]; and
12	(2) Less than eighteen years of age shall drive a moped
13	unless the person wears a safety helmet securely
14	fastened with a chin strap.
15	The safety helmet shall meet the specifications and requirements
16	established by rules adopted by the director."
17	PART II
18	SECTION 7. The purpose of this part is to encourage safety
19	on Hawaii's roadways through motor vehicle safety standards by
20	prohibiting moped and motor scooter rental companies from
21	renting any moped or motor scooter that has an aftermarket

1	modification to the motor of the moped or the motor of a motor	
2	scooter.	
3	SECTION 8. Section 291C-206, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
4	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:	
5	"(a) A motor used to power a moped shall not be modified	
6	in any manner except as authorized by the motor manufacturer and	
7	any such modification shall not increase the power capacity of	
8	the motor above two horsepower (one thousand four hundred	
ģ	ninety-two watts) $[\cdot]$, and no person shall rent or lease to	
10	another person any moped or motor scooter that has an	
11	aftermarket modification to the motor of the moped or motor	
12	scooter that does not comply with this subsection."	
13	PART III	
14	SECTION 9. This Act does not affect rights and duties that	
15	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were	
16	begun before its effective date.	
17	SECTION 10. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed	
18	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.	
19	SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Mopeds; Motor Scooters; Rentals; Lexi's Law; Helmet Requirements; Violation

Description:

Requires all moped and motor scooter rental companies to ensure the rider wears a safety helmet supplied either by the rental company or by the renter prior to operating the moped or motor scooter. Exempts riders with a motorcycle license from this requirement. Prohibits the rental of any moped or motor scooter with aftermarket modifications. Amends the definition of motor scooter.
