
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HELICOPTERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that helicopter crashes
2 and resulting deaths continue to be a matter of public concern
3 in Hawaii. There have been at least eighteen civilian
4 helicopter crashes in Hawaii since 2015, occurring on Oahu,
5 Hawaii island, Kauai, and Molokai.

6 Hawaii residents are not only concerned with the dangers
7 associated with helicopter crashes, such as the December 2019
8 crash on Kauai or the April 2019 crash on a residential street
9 in Kailua, but also with issues related to helicopter noise,
10 frequency, and altitude. These concerns related to helicopters
11 in Hawaii remain largely unresolved. The legislature believes
12 that requiring commercial helicopter owners and operators to
13 report basic details of helicopter flights will help provide
14 necessary information to stakeholders and community members in
15 order to find a meaningful resolution to this area of concern.

16 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:



1 (1) Require commercial helicopter owners and operators to
 2 submit to the department of transportation monthly
 3 reports that contain basic helicopter flight
 4 information; and

5 (2) Require the department of transportation to post to
 6 the department's website the foregoing reports and
 7 monthly reports on helicopter complaints.

8 SECTION 2. Chapter 261, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 9 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
 10 and to read as follows:

11 "§261- Reporting of commercial helicopter flights;
 12 reports of complaints on helicopters. (a) For each helicopter
 13 subject to this chapter, the owner or operator of that
 14 helicopter shall submit to the department a report that includes
 15 details of each flight the helicopter made for commercial
 16 purposes during the preceding calendar month.

17 (b) The report shall include, regarding each flight made
 18 for commercial purposes:

19 (1) The date and time that the helicopter took off and
 20 landed;



- 1 (2) The number of individuals in the helicopter during the
- 2 flight;
- 3 (3) The flight path, including altitudes, from take-off
- 4 through landing; and
- 5 (4) Whether the helicopter deviated from its flight plan,
- 6 including an explanation for the deviation.
- 7 (c) The report required pursuant to this section shall be
- 8 submitted to the department no later than 4:30 p.m. on the
- 9 fifteenth day of the month following the month for which the
- 10 report is required.
- 11 (d) The department shall post to the department's website:
- 12 (1) Each report required under this section within one
- 13 week of the department's receipt of the report from a
- 14 helicopter owner or operator; and
- 15 (2) Monthly reports on the number of novel public
- 16 complaints, by region as identified by the
- 17 complainant, received by the department regarding
- 18 helicopters each month.
- 19 (e) The failure to submit a report to the department
- 20 pursuant to subsection (a) shall constitute a violation of this
- 21 chapter, and the owner or operator of the helicopter shall be



1 subject to the penalties established pursuant to section
2 261-21."

3 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
5 begun before its effective date.

6 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

7 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
