## HOUSE RESOLUTION

DESIGNATING MAY 17, 2021, AS DIFFUSE INTRINSIC PONTINE GLIOMA AWARENESS DAY.

WHEREAS, the legislature finds that for the past three

2	years, Governor Ige has declared May 17 as Diffuse Intrinsic
3	Pontine Glioma (DIPG) Awareness Day; and
5	WHEREAS, according to national statistics there are
6	approximately two hundred to three hundred new cases of DIPG
7	annually in the United States; and
8 9	WHEDEAC DIDGs are bighly opposite and difficult to these
9 10	WHEREAS, DIPGs are highly aggressive and difficult to treat brain tumors that occur at the base of the brain; and
11	prain camers that occur at the base of the brain, and
12	WHEREAS, these tumors are found in an area of the brainstem
13	that controls vital functions including breathing, blood
14 15	pressure, and heart rate; and
16	WHEREAS, the location of the tumors does not generally
17	allow for their surgical removal; and

19	WHEREAS, these tumors are generally treated with radiation
20 21	therapy, but currently no successful chemotherapeutic agent has been obtained; and

23	WHEREAS, DIPG largely affects the pediatric population as
24	it is usually diagnosed during childhood between the ages of
25	five and nine years of age; and
26 27	WHEREAS, DIPG tumors occur equally in boys and girls and do
28	not generally appear in adulthood; and

30	WHEREAS, patients afflicted by DIPG do not generally
31	survive beyond a year after the initial diagnosis; and

1 WHEREAS, only one per cent of children diagnosed with DIPG 2 survive more than three years; and

WHEREAS, as such, DIPG occurs in the most vulnerable among us; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, that May 17, 2021, be designated as "Diffuse Intrinsic Pontine Glioma Awareness Day"; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education, Department of Health, and United States Department of Health and Human Services are encouraged to increase public awareness so each individual in the United States becomes better informed and aware of DIPG; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the United States Secretary of Health and Human Services, Governor, Chairperson of the Board of Education, Superintendent of Education, and Director of Health.
