
HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR TO APPOINT A NATIVE HAWAIIAN SPECIAL ASSISTANT IN THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR.

1 WHEREAS, appointing a native Hawaiian special assistant in
2 the office of the governor will strengthen the bridge of
3 communication between the native Hawaiian community, state
4 agencies and other stakeholders, and the governor of Hawaii to
5 address prevalent social and economic issues impacting the
6 wellbeing of native Hawaiians in the state; and

8 WHEREAS, a native Hawaiian special assistant would provide
9 policy direction and collaborate with many stakeholders to
10 address legislative priorities; and
11

12 WHEREAS, a native Hawaiian special assistant would serve as
13 a community liaison and direct point of contact in the
14 governor's office, which will increase opportunities for the
15 native Hawaiian community to vocalize their concerns directly to
16 the governor of Hawaii; now, therefore,

18 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
19 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
20 of 2021, urges the governor of the state of Hawaii to appoint a
21 native Hawaiian special assistant to serve as a liaison between
22 the native Hawaiian community and the governor of Hawaii to
23 serve the best interests of the native Hawaiian community in the
24 state; and

26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
27 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Chairperson of the
28 Board of Trustees of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, Chairperson
29 of the Hawaiian Homes Commission, and Chair of the House of
30 Representatives Standing Committee on Judiciary and Hawaiian
31 Affairs.
