HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO REVIEW AND REPORT ON THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION'S PROGRESS TOWARD, AND NEXT STEPS FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF, AN ALTERNATIVE CERTIFICATION PROGRAM FOR SCHOOL LEADERS, PURSUANT TO TITLE 8, CHAPTER 65, HAWAII ADMINISTRATIVE RULES.

WHEREAS, strong school leadership is fundamental to creating an exceptional learning environment; and

WHEREAS, the anticipated upcoming retirements of many current public school principals will likely exacerbate the need for dynamic new leaders; and

WHEREAS, visionary leaders with fresh perspectives are more important than ever as changes to the local and global economies require students to graduate with a future-oriented set of skills; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Education's current system for hiring school leaders may unnecessarily restrict qualified and talented applicants from charter, private, or out-of-state schools; and

WHEREAS, the Hawaii Administrative Rules have articulated the requirements for an alternative certification program for school leaders since 2012; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, that the Department of Education is requested to convene a working group to review and report on the Department of Education's progress toward, and next steps for implementation of, an alternative certification program for school leaders, pursuant to title 8, chapter 65, Hawaii Administrative Rules; and
