## HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO GRANT ADDITIONAL AUTHORITY  
TO THE FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION TO STOP UNWANTED  
AND ILLEGAL ROBOCALLS.

1           WHEREAS, the receipt of unwanted telephone calls are the  
2 most frequent complaints received by the Federal Communications  
3 Commission from consumers nationwide; and  
4

5           WHEREAS, unwanted calls include automated telemarketing or  
6 solicitation calls that deliver a recorded message, also known  
7 as robocalls; and  
8

9           WHEREAS, recently, robocalls have been combined with a  
10 process called "spoofing", by which robocalls appear to  
11 originate from local, often legitimate, numbers to trick  
12 consumers into answering the robocalls; and  
13

14           WHEREAS, as technology continues to evolve, the number of  
15 robocalls and spoofing continues to grow; and  
16

17           WHEREAS, under the Federal Truth in Caller ID Act of 2009,  
18 individuals are prohibited from transmitting misleading or  
19 inaccurate caller ID information with the intent to defraud,  
20 cause harm, or wrongly obtain anything of value; and  
21

22           WHEREAS, despite the fact that the Federal Communications  
23 Commission has initiated new policy initiatives to combat  
24 robocalls and spoofing, additional measures need to be  
25 implemented to combat this growing problem; and

27           WHEREAS, the United States Congress should pass legislation  
28 that provides the Federal Communications Commission with the  
29 tools and resources it needs to combat robocalls and spoofing;

1 WHEREAS, the Federal Communications Commission encourages  
2 consumers to file a complaint with the Federal Communications  
3 Commission when a robocall is received; and

5 WHEREAS, although the Federal Communications Commission  
6 uses social media and the Internet to reach consumers, the  
7 Federal Communications Commission should use all means available  
8 to provide consumers with the information necessary to file a  
9 complaint; now, therefore,

11 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
12 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session  
13 of 2021, that the United States Congress is urged to grant  
14 additional authority to the Federal Communications Commission to  
15 stop unwanted and illegal robocalls; and

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
18 Resolution be transmitted to the President Pro Tempore of the  
19 United States Senate, Speaker of the United States House of  
20 Representatives, members of the Hawaii Congressional Delegation,  
21 and Federal Communications Commission Chairman.
