
HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO
SUBMIT A PETITION TO LIST THE OAHU PUEO AS A THREATENED OR
ENDANGERED SPECIES UNDER THE ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT.

1 WHEREAS, the Hawaiian short-eared owl, *Asio flammeus*
2 *sandwichensis*, commonly known as the pueo, is an endemic
3 subspecies of the short-eared owl; and
4

5 WHEREAS, the pueo is believed to have become established in
6 the Hawaiian Islands after the arrival of the first Polynesians
7 and is now endemic to all major islands of Hawaii except Ni'ihau;
8 and
9

10 WHEREAS, the pueo was revered by Hawaiians, and was an
11 aumakua or ancestral guardian of many Hawaiian families, and an
12 encounter with the pueo was considered to be an omen; and
13

14 WHEREAS, in Hawaiian mythology, the pueo is the "bird of
15 wisdom," known for offering guidance and protection; and
16

17 WHEREAS, in the late 1800s, pueo once flew in great numbers
18 on O'ahu, but today, according to The Pueo Project, a study by
19 the College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources of the
20 University of Hawaii at Manoa and the Department of Natural
21 Resources and Environmental Management of the Department of Land
22 and Natural Resources, the number of pueo on Oahu has declined
23 to an estimated eight hundred seven individual birds; and

25 WHEREAS, pueo nest on the ground, in grassy areas, laying
26 three to six eggs over a few months; and
27

28 WHEREAS, pueo eggs and young pueo are vulnerable to feral
29 cats, dogs, rats, and mongooses; and

1 WHEREAS, in addition to being vulnerable to many predators,
2 loss of habitat has contributed to the reduction in the pueo
3 population; and

4
5 WHEREAS, Chapter 13-124, Exhibit 2, Hawaii Administrative
6 Rules, lists the pueo on Oahu as endangered; and



8 WHEREAS, protections for the pueo under state law and
9 administrative rule are limited to prohibiting persons from
10 exporting, possessing, processing, selling, offering for sale,
11 delivering, carrying, transporting, or shipping, harassing,
12 harming, pursuing, hunting, shooting, wounding, killing,
13 trapping, capturing, or collecting pueo and removing, damaging,
14 or disturbing the nests of pueo; and

15
16 WHEREAS, without federal protection, the Oahu pueo will be
17 at risk of extinction; and

18
19 WHEREAS, protections provided under the Endangered Species
20 Act can help the pueo population increase to a healthy and
21 sustainable level; now, therefore,

23 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
24 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session
25 of 2021, that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is
26 requested to petition the United States Secretary of the
27 Interior, through the United States Fish and Wildlife Service,
28 to protect the Oahu pueo, also known as the Hawaiian short-eared
29 owl (*Asio flammeus sandwichensis*) as a threatened or endangered
30 species; and

32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
33 Resolution be transmitted to Chairperson of the Board of Land
34 and Natural Resources and the Program Manager of the Endangered
35 Species Recovery Committee.
