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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OFFICE OF YOUTH SERVICES.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 352D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated  
3 and to read as follows:  
4           "§352D- Office of youth services revolving fund;  
5 commercial enterprise vocational programs. (a) There is  
6 established the office of youth services revolving fund to be  
7 administered by the office. All moneys collected from the sale  
8 of goods and services by individual commercial enterprise  
9 vocational programs and appropriations made by the legislature  
10 shall be deposited into the office of youth services revolving  
11 fund. The moneys in the office of youth services revolving fund  
12 shall be used for the purposes of vocational programs within the  
13 office as determined by the office.  
14           (b) The administrator for each individual commercial  
15 enterprise vocational program shall:  
16           (1) Determine the prices at which all goods and services  
17           are sold; provided that the prices shall be as near to



1           the prevailing market prices for similar goods and  
 2           services as practicable; and  
 3           (2) Ensure that the quality of goods and services produced  
 4           is comparable to similar goods and services available  
 5           from the private sector; provided that for sales to  
 6           the State or the counties, the quality of the goods or  
 7           services shall be consistent with the specifications  
 8           for the goods or services requested.

9           (c) Each individual commercial enterprise vocational  
 10 program may market goods and services to the public and private  
 11 sectors."

12           SECTION 2. Section 352D-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
 13 amended by:

14           1. Adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted  
 15 and to read:

16           "Commercial enterprise vocational program" means a  
 17 vocational program for young adults only that engages in the  
 18 for-profit activity of providing goods and services for purposes  
 19 of promoting self-sustainability in young adults."

20           2. Amending the definition of "young adult at risk" or  
 21 "young adult" to read:



1 "Young adult at risk" or "young adult" means any adult  
2 between the ages of eighteen and twenty-four who ~~has~~ :

3 (1) Has been arrested, [~~who~~] has had contact with the  
4 police, [~~who~~] or is experiencing social, emotional,  
5 psychological, educational, or physical problems[~~r~~];  
6 and [~~who is~~]

7 (2) Is no longer eligible for child protective services  
8 provided by the State due to the adult's age."

9 SECTION 3. Section 352D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
10 amended to read as follows:

11 "**§352D-4 Establishment; purpose.** (a) There is  
12 established within the department of human services for  
13 administrative purposes only the office of youth services. The  
14 office of youth services is established to provide services and  
15 programs for youth at risk under one umbrella agency in order to  
16 facilitate optimum service delivery, to prevent delinquency, and  
17 to reduce the incidence of recidivism among juveniles through  
18 the provision of prevention, rehabilitation, and treatment  
19 services. The office shall also be responsible for program  
20 planning and development, intake/assessment, oversight, as well



1 as consultation, technical assistance, and staff training  
2 relating to the delivery of services.

3 (b) The office shall provide a continuum of services as  
4 follows:

5 (1) An integrated intake/assessment and case management  
6 system;

7 (2) The necessary educational, vocational, social  
8 counseling and mental health services; provided that  
9 the department of education shall be the only provider  
10 of standards-based education services for all youth at  
11 risk and young adults identified with special  
12 education needs or actively receiving special  
13 education services, in accordance with the  
14 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act  
15 (20 U.S.C. 1400 et seq.) and all applicable federal  
16 and state educational requirements;

17 (3) Community-based shelter and residential facilities;

18 (4) Oversight of youth services; ~~and~~

19 (5) Commercial enterprise vocational programs; and



1       ~~[(5)]~~ (6) Other programs that encourage the development of  
2                   positive self-images and useful skills in youth~~[-]~~ at  
3                   risk and young adults.

4       (c) The executive director of the office of youth services  
5 shall submit annual reports to the legislature no later than  
6 twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session,  
7 reporting the services or programs funded pursuant to this  
8 section, the number of youth at risk and young adults served by  
9 each service or program, ~~[and]~~ the results of the services or  
10 programs funded~~[-]~~, and all fiscal transactions and expenses of  
11 each service or program; provided that the director of human  
12 services shall conduct an immediate audit of the office of youth  
13 services if the office of youth services fails to submit an  
14 annual report on the fiscal transactions and expenses of each  
15 service or program in a timely manner.

16       (d) To this end, on July 1, 1991, this office shall assume  
17 the responsibilities for juvenile corrections functions, which  
18 were temporarily placed in the department of corrections  
19 pursuant to Act 338, Session Laws of Hawaii 1987. These  
20 functions shall include but not be limited to all



1 responsibilities, under chapter 352, for the Hawaii youth  
2 correctional facilities."

3 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2060.



**Report Title:**

Office of Youth Services Revolving Fund; Commercial Enterprise Vocational Programs; Annual Reports; Director of Human Services; Audit

**Description:**

Permits individual vocational programs within the purview of the office of youth services to engage in commercial enterprises, including the sale of goods and services, for self-sustainability purposes, for young adults only. Establishes the office of youth services revolving fund. Requires the office of youth services to submit annual reports to the legislature on the fiscal transactions and expenses of each service or program. Requires the director of human services to conduct an audit of the office of youth services if the annual fiscal transactions and expenses reports are not submitted in a timely manner. Effective 7/1/2060. (HD1)
