A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a fundamental
- 2 objective of the State's procurement practices and procedures is
- 3 to control and, where possible, appropriately minimize costs to
- 4 the State and counties, including both immediate and future
- 5 costs. The procurement of goods, services, and construction by
- 6 the State and counties can materially affect the ongoing
- 7 "life-cycle" operating and maintenance costs of the State and
- 8 counties.
- 9 The legislature further finds that although existing law
- 10 encourages the consideration of ongoing life-cycle costs to
- 11 promote energy efficiency, it neither requires nor effectively
- 12 provides for the full and effective accounting and consideration
- 13 of life-cycle operation and maintenance costs in procurement
- 14 practices and procedures. Full and effective accounting and
- 15 consideration of life-cycle costs in the procurement of goods,
- 16 services, and construction is critical to ensure the economic
- 17 management of the State's financial resources.



- 1 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the procurement
- 2 policy board to adopt specific rules that require the
- 3 consideration of life-cycle costs in all state procurements.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 103D-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 6 and to read as follows:
- 7 ""Life-cycle costs" means the sum of the present values of
- 8 investment costs, capital costs, installation costs, energy
- 9 costs, operating costs, maintenance costs, and disposal costs,
- 10 over the lifetime of the project, product, or measure."
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 103D-211, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- "\$103D-211 Procurement rules. (a) The procurement policy
- 14 board shall adopt all rules necessary to carry out the purposes
- 15 of this chapter and to implement its provisions in accordance
- 16 with chapter 91. The policy board shall not delegate its power
- 17 to adopt rules.
- 18 (b) No rule shall change any commitment, right, or
- 19 obligation of the State or of a contractor under a contract in
- 20 existence on the effective date of such rule.

3	(1)	Provide standards and procedures for the effective		
4		consideration of expected operation, maintenance,

7		<u>(A)</u>	The determination of which types of procurements	
8			shall require an analysis and identification of	
9			life-cycle costs used in bid evaluation;	
10		<u>(B)</u>	The specification of methods for the	
11			determination of life-cycle costs used in bid	
12			evaluation; and	
13		(C)	The specification of criteria and methods for	
14			appropriate weighing of life-cycle costs in bid	
15			evaluation; and	
16	(2)	Ensure that modifications to the contracts or		
17		specifications for procurements, including any value		
18		engineering provisions in accordance with		
19		section 103D-411, do not result in net increases to		
20		the total costs, including immediate or future		
21		oper	ating, maintenance, disposal, or any other	

1	directly-induced costs associated with the procured		
2	goods, services, or construction to the State or		
3	counties."		
4	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.		
5	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.
