BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 386-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- amended to read as follows: 2
- 3 "§386-5 Exclusiveness of right to compensation; exception.
- The rights and remedies herein granted to an employee or the 4
- employee's dependents on account of a work injury suffered by 5
- the employee shall exclude all other liability of the employer 6
- 7 to the employee, the employee's legal representative, spouse,
- dependents, next of kin, or anyone else entitled to recover
- damages from the employer, at common law or otherwise, on 9
- account of the injury, except for sexual harassment or sexual 10
- assault and infliction of emotional distress or invasion of 11
- privacy related thereto, and COVID-19 contracted by an employee 12
- whose employer failed to maintain adequate workplace protections 13
- 14 against exposure to the novel coronavirus, in which case a civil
- action may also be brought." 15

Description:

Creates an exception to the exclusive right to compensation under workers' compensation law where COVID-19 is contracted by an employee whose employer failed to maintain adequate workplace protections against exposure to the novel coronavirus. Creates a presumption that COVID-19 has been proximately caused by an employer's failure to maintain adequate workplace protections against exposure to the novel coronavirus.
